ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 10.08 REGARDING SPEED LIMITS BY CHANGING THE PRIMA FACIE SPEED FOR CLIMAX ROAD, SHAKE RIDGE ROAD, AND WILLOW CREEK ROAD, ALONG WITH OTHER NON-SUBSTANTIVE CHANGES

The Board of Supervisors of the County of Amador does ordain as follows:

SECTION I. Recitals of Facts and Determinations in Support of Ordinance.

- A. The California Vehicle Code Section 22358 provides that whenever the County determines upon the basis of an engineering and traffic survey that the current speed limit is more than is reasonable or safe upon any portion of any street other than a state highway, the County may by ordinance determine and declare a reasonable and safe prima facie speed limit which is found most appropriate to facilitate the orderly movement of traffic and that is reasonable and safe. The declared prima facie limit shall be effective when appropriate signs giving notice thereof are erected upon the roadway section.
- B. The County Public Works Agency conducted updated engineering and traffic surveys on various County roads to gather information for determining the reasonable speed limits. The results of the speed surveys recommend the following changes:

with respect to Climax Road 1.2 miles west of State Highway 88 to 2.3 miles west of State Highway 88, the prima facie speed limit should be changed from 35 miles per hour to 40 miles per hour;

with respect to Shake Ridge Road from Wandering Hills Drive to State Highway 88, the prima facie speed limit should be changed from 30 miles per hour to 35 miles per hour; and

with respect to Willow Creek Road from PM 1.74 to State Highway 124, the prima facie speed limit should be changed from 45 miles per hour to 50 miles per hour.

C. Following a review by staff, additional, non-substantive changes to Chapter 10.08 should be made.

SECTION II. Chapter 10.08 of the Amador County Code is hereby amended as follows:

10.08.040 Climax Road.

On the basis of an engineering and traffic survey, the board determines and declares a prima facie speed limit of thirty five forty miles per hour as the most appropriate to

facilitate the movement of traffic in a reasonable and safe manner on that portion of Climax Road one and one-tenth miles in length beginning at a point located one and two-tents miles west of State Highway Route 88 to and including a point located two and three-tenths miles west of State Highway Route 88 from PM 0.77 to PM 1.95.

10.08.150 Sutter Creek-Volcano County Road No. 12.

On the basis of an engineering and -traffic survey, the board determines and declares a prima facie speed of thirty-five miles per hour on that portion of Sutter Creek-Volcano County Road No. 12 from that road's intersection with the city limits of the city of Sutter Creek to that road's intersection with Pine Gulch Road, and forty-five miles per hour on said Sutter Creek-Volcano County Road No. 12 from said intersection with Pine Gulch Road to the town of Volcano.

10.08.180 Irishtown-Weiland Mine Road No. 106.

On the basis of an engineering and traffic survey, the board determines and declares a prima facie speed of thirty-five miles per hour from Highway 88 (Post Mile 1.96 to Post Mile 1.33) 0.15 miles south of Spagnoli Mine Road intersection.

10.08.280 Kennedy Flat Road No. 22.

On the basis of <u>a updated</u> speed surveys dated April 3, 2001 and April 5, 2001, the board determines and declares a prima facie speed of thirty-five miles per hour on Kennedy Flat Road.

10.08.310 Shake Ridge Road, County Road No. 9.

On the basis of an engineering and traffic survey, tThe board determines and declares a prima facie speed of forty miles per hour from Ram's Horn Grade to Wandering Hills Drive and thirty-five (35) miles per hour from Wandering Hills Drive to Highway 88.

10.08.320 Willow Creek Road No. 287.

On the basis of an engineering and traffic survey the board determines and declares a prima facie speed of forty five miles per hour on Willow Creek Road from the intersection of State Highway 124 easterly to PM 1.74, and a prima facie speed of fifty miles per hour from PM 1.74 to the intersection of State Highway 16.

10.08.330 Fiddletown Road No. 52.

On the basis of an engineering and traffic survey-dated March 2001, the board determines and declares a prima facie speed of twenty-five miles per hour on Fiddletown Road from PM 4.80 to 5.90 within the community of Fiddletown.

SECTION III. Except as set forth above, the remainder of Chapter 10.08 is unaffected by this

ordinance and is deemed reenacted without amendment.

SECTION IV. This ordinance shall be published within fifteen days after the date hereof in a newspaper of general circulation printed and published in the County of Amador, State of California, and shall become effective thirty days after the date hereof.

Dear Supervisors,

Our concern is with the unsafe speed limit along Climax Road around the Pioneer Drive and Ridge Road intersections, a two mile stretch. Vehicles are turning out from residential areas into traffic traveling 60-65 mph.

CONCERNS:

- Exciting Pioneer Drive onto Climax is a blind intersection and when a vehicle is parked in the pull-out area to the left it becomes doubly unsafe.
- Heading eastbound on Ridge Rd and turning left onto Upper Ridge is dangerous with vehicles traveling 60 mph.
- The shade conceals vehicles heading eastbound on Climax near Ridge Road. A few years ago there was a fatal accident when a vehicle heading eastbound on Ridge made a left turn onto Upper Ridge in front of a logging truck because shadows made the truck invisible.

REQUESTS:

- Lowering the speed limit on Climax Rd from Pioneer Drive to New York Road, a two mile stretch will save lives.
- Headlights sign on Climax Rd near Pioneer Drive for westbound traffic will make it safer.
- No parking sign in pull-out area at Pioneer Drive will make it safer.

We are hoping you will consider these requests that will make our roads safer.

- Apply for a CDBG Planning Grant on behalf of the River Pines Community **River Pines Water System** is very old, originally installed in 1928. (See attached photos). It is experiencing extremely high levels of water loss now. In addition to the water loss issue, there are many

experiencing extremely high levels of water loss now. In addition to the water loss issue, there are many substandard system components which will have health or safety impacts in the near future. Some of these problems are:

- *Many locations with no real fire flow, ¾" original lines to 2" lines.
- *Primary water source can barely meet existing max day demand.
- **Cannot meet State Health standards for 2nd source of water, only 1 well operating now.
- *Many dead end lines
- ** Undersized" mains" that are substandard by anyone's standard. Original 3/4" galvanized servicing multiple houses.
- *Excessive pressures (over 100 psi) in many areas which compound the leakage issues.
- *No backup power at water source or any place in the system.
- *Water loss which is currently around 21% -38%,
- *Very old storage tanks

Annexation No.8 CFD 2006-1 (Fire Services)

In January 2006 the Board of Supervisors adopted resolutions forming Amador County Community Facilities District 2006-1 (Fire Services) and adopted Ordinance 1640 which imposes participation in CFD 2006-1 as a mitigation requirement on all future subdivisions of land and certain use permits.

Property owners in the CFD are responsible for the annual payment of a special tax which can only be used for fire services. The current special tax rate of the county's CFD is \$591.92 per year for a residential single family dwelling.

On August 13, 2013 the Board adopted a Resolution of Intention for the annexation of the properties in the map for Annexation No.8 and set September 24th as the date to hear the matter.

The annexation of the properties into CFD 2006-1 requires approval, by a two-thirds margin, of qualified voters in the proposed CFD. As there are fewer than twelve registered voters within the properties proposed for this annexation, the annexation can be approved by a vote of the current landowners. Each owner(s) has a weighted vote based on the acreage of their property.


Each of the landowners has signed a Waiver and Consent relative to the election process and authorized a representative to cast the votes and execute the ballot assigned to the property.







WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors (the "Board") of the County of Amador (the "County") has conducted proceedings under the Mello-Roos Community Facilities Act of 1982 (the "Act") to establish Community Facilities District No. 2006-1 (Fire Protection Services), County of Amador, State of California (the "Community Facilities District"), to authorize the levy of special taxes (the "Special Taxes") upon the land within the Community Facilities District, the proceeds of which are to be used to finance certain public fire protection services; and

WHEREAS, the Board, by Resolution No. 13 - 072 (the "Resolution of Intention to Annex Territory") adopted by the Board on August 13, 2013 has determined that the public convenience and necessity require the annexation of the territory (the "Additional Territory") described on the map entitled "Annexation Map No. 8 of Community Facilities District No. 2006-1 (Fire Protection Services), County of Amador, State of California" (the "Annexation Map") attached to the Resolution of Intention to Annex Territory, which Annexation Map was recorded on August 23, 2013, in Book 1 of Maps of Assessment and Community Facilities Districts of the County of Amador at Page 364 and Page 365, further designated as instrument number 2013-0007645, and has further determined that such annexation is advantageous to the Community Facilities District and the owners of the property within the Community Facilities District; and

WHEREAS, the Resolution of Intention to Annex Territory fixed Tuesday, the 24th day of September, 2013, at the hour of 10:30 o'clock a.m., or as soon thereafter as the Board could consider the matter, in the Board of Supervisors' Chambers in the Amador County Administration Center at 810 Court Street, Jackson, California as the time and place for a public hearing to be held by the Board to consider the proposed annexation of the Additional Territory to the Community Facilities District and all other matters set forth in the Resolution of Intention to Annex Territory, and notice of the public hearing was duly given as provided in the Resolution of Intention to Annex Territory; and

WHEREAS, on September 24, 2013, the Board opened the public hearing at the time and place scheduled and at the public hearing all persons interested, including all taxpayers, property owners and registered voters within the Community Facilities District and within the Additional Territory, were given an opportunity to appear and to be heard, and the testimony of all interested persons or taxpayers for or against the proposed annexation or any other matters set forth in the Resolution of Intention to Annex Territory was heard and considered, and the Board then closed the public hearing; and

WHEREAS, written protests against the annexation were not submitted by 50 percent of the registered voters, or by six registered voters (whichever is more) residing within the Community Facilities District, or by 50 percent of the registered voters or six registered voters (whichever is more) residing within the Additional Territory; nor were written protests against the annexation submitted by the owners of one-half of the area of land in the territory included in the Community Facilities District, nor by the owners of one-half of the area of land in the Additional Territory; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 53339.7 of the Act, the proposition to annex the Additional Territory to the Community Facilities District and to subject the Additional Territory to the Special Taxes is to be submitted to the qualified electors of the Additional Territory; and

WHEREAS, the Board is fully advised in this matter;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. <u>Declaration of the Board</u>. The Board hereby specifically finds and declares that the actions authorized hereby constitute and are with respect to public affairs of the County and that the statements, findings and determinations of the County set forth above and in the preambles of the documents approved herein are true and correct.

SECTION 2. <u>Matter to be Submitted to Qualified Electors</u>. Pursuant to Section 53339.7 and Sections 53318 *et seq.* of the Act, the proposition to annex the Additional Territory to the Community Facilities District and to subject the Additional Territory to the levy of the Special Taxes shall be submitted to the qualified electors of the Additional Territory at an election called therefor as provided below.

SECTION 3. <u>Findings as to Fire Protection Services</u>. The Board hereby finds and determines that the fire protection services to be financed by the Community Facilities District in the Additional Territory are in addition to those provided within the Additional Territory prior to this proposed annexation, and that the financed services will not supplant fire protection services currently available within the Additional Territory.

SECTION 4. <u>Declaration of Landowner Vote</u>. The Board accepts the Certificate re: Registered Voters heretofore filed in these proceedings and finds, in accordance therewith, that during the ninety days preceding the close of the public hearing there have been times when there were fewer than twelve registered voters residing within the Additional Territory. Accordingly, under Sections 53326(b) and 53339.7 of the Government Code, the qualified electors of the Additional Territory for the proposed special election shall be the owners of land within the Additional Territory.

SECTION 5. Specification of Landowner Qualified Electors. The Board accepts the Certificate re: Landowners heretofore filed in these proceedings and finds, in accordance therewith, that the owners of land within the Additional Territory are the Landowners set forth in the attachment to the Certificate re: Landowners and that the attachment correctly sets forth the amount of property owned by each Landowner and the number of votes to which each Landowner is entitled pursuant to Sections 53326(b) and 53339.7, being the number of acres owned rounded up to the next whole acre.

SECTION 6. Findings Regarding Form of Waiver of Election Requirements. The Board hereby approves the form of "Property Owner's Waiver and Consent Shortening Time Periods and Waiving Various Requirements for Conducting a Mailed-Ballot Election in Annexation Proceedings and Appointment of Representative to Act for Property Owner in Voting and Casting Ballot" (the "Waiver, Consent and Appointment") by which the time limits and related requirements respecting preparation and distribution of election materials are waived, a copy of which is attached hereto as Exhibit B.1 and B.2. The Board hereby finds that the rights, procedures and time periods therein waived are solely for the protection of the qualified electors and may be waived by the qualified electors under Sections 53326(a), 53327(b) and 53339.7 of the Act and under other provisions of law dealing with waiver generally, and that the Waiver, Consent and Appointment constitutes a full and knowing waiver, by any qualified elector who has executed the form, of those rights, procedures and time periods.

SECTION 7. Findings Regarding Receipt of Election Waivers. The Board further finds and determines, based on a Certificate of Clerk re: Receipt of Property Owner Waiver and Consent Forms, provided this date by the Clerk, that each Landowner, or an authorized representative of each Landowner, has filed with the Clerk a properly executed Waiver, Consent and Appointment. The Board therefore is establishing the procedures and time periods for this special mailed-ballot election without regard to statutory schedules.

SECTION 8. <u>Call of Election</u>. Pursuant to Sections 53326 and 53339.7 of the Government Code, the Board hereby calls an election, to be held and conducted forthwith upon adoption of this Resolution, and sets September 24, 2013, as the election date. Pursuant to Sections 53326 and 53339.7 of the Government Code, the election shall be conducted by mailed ballot; provided that personal service of the respective ballots to authorized representatives of each Landowner is permitted under the terms of the Waiver, Consent and Appointment forms on file with the Clerk and shall therefore be permitted. The Clerk is directed to either mail or make personal service of the ballots, in the form of the attached <u>Exhibit A</u>, to each Landowner or, if one has been appointed pursuant to a Waiver, Consent and Appointment, to the Landowner's authorized representative.

SECTION 9. <u>Form of Ballot Measure</u>. The proposition to be submitted to the qualified electors of the Additional Territory shall be as set forth in the form of special election ballot attached hereto as <u>Exhibit A</u>.

SECTION 10. <u>Specifications of the Election Order</u>. The Clerk is hereby designated as the official to conduct the special mailed-ballot election pursuant to the Act and California Elections Code Sections 307 and 320 and the following provisions:

- (a) The special election shall be held and conducted, and the votes canvassed and the returns made, and the results determined, as provided herein; and in all particulars not prescribed by this Resolution the special election shall be held and conducted and the votes received and canvassed in the manner provided by law for the holding of special elections consistent with the Act.
- (b) All Landowners within the Additional Territory as of the close of the Public Hearing shall be qualified to vote upon the proposition to be submitted at the special election.
- (c) The special election shall be conducted as a mailed-ballot election, in accordance with the provisions of the Act and the proceedings of the Board, and there shall be no polling places for the special election. All ballots shall be delivered or mailed by the Clerk to the Landowners, and all voted ballots are required to be received by the Clerk not later than 12:00 noon on the day of the election in order to be counted. However, if at any time the Clerk determines that all votes have been cast, the Clerk shall immediately declare the election closed.
- (d) Each voter desiring to vote in favor of the proposition to be submitted at the special election shall mark a cross (x) or similar mark in the box next to the word "YES" on the ballot to the right of the proposition; and each voter desiring to vote against the proposition shall mark a cross (x) or similar mark in the box next to the word "NO" on the ballot to the right of the proposition. The cross (x) or similar mark may be marked with either pen or pencil.
- (e) The Clerk shall commence the canvass of the returns of the special election, and report the returns to the Board as soon as she may.
- (f) The Board may thereupon declare the results of the special election, and shall cause to be spread upon its minutes a statement of the results of the special election as ascertained by the canvass.
- SECTION 11. <u>Two-Thirds Vote Required</u>. Pursuant to Section 53339.8 of the Act, the above proposition shall become effective upon the affirmative vote of two-thirds or more of the votes cast upon the proposition.
- SECTION 12. <u>County Officers Authorized to Act to Effectuate this Resolution</u>. The officers of the County are hereby authorized and directed, individually and collectively, to do any and all things that they deem necessary or advisable in order to effectuate the purposes of this Resolution.
- SECTION 13. <u>Effective Date</u>. This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption.

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors (the "Board") of the County of Amador (the "County") has conducted proceedings under the Mello-Roos Community Facilities Act of 1982 (the "Act") to establish Community Facilities District No. 2006-1 (Fire Protection Services), County of Amador, State of California (the "Community Facilities District"), to authorize the levy of special taxes (the "Special Taxes") upon the land within the Community Facilities District, the proceeds of which are to be used to finance certain public fire protection services; and

WHEREAS, the Board, by Resolution No. 13-072 (the "Resolution of Intention to Annex Territory") adopted on August 13, 2013, determined that the public convenience and necessity required the annexation of the territory (the "Additional Territory") described on the map entitled "Annexation Map No. 8 of Community Facilities District No. 2006-1 (Fire Protection Services), County of Amador, State of California" (the "Annexation Map") attached to the Resolution of Intention to Annex Territory, which Annexation Map was recorded on August 23, 2013, in Book 1 of Maps of Assessment and Community Facilities Districts of the County of Amador at Page 364 and Page 365, and further referenced as instrument number 2013-0007645, and the Board further determined that such annexation would be advantageous to the Community Facilities District and the owners of the property in the Community Facilities District; and

WHEREAS, the Resolution of Intention to Annex Territory fixed Tuesday, the 24th day of September, 2013, at the hour of 10:30 o'clock A.M., or as soon thereafter as the Board could consider the matter, in the Board of Supervisors' Chambers in the Amador County Administration Center at 810 Court Street, Jackson, California as the time and place for a public hearing to be held by the Board to consider the proposed annexation of the Additional Territory to the Community Facilities District and all other matters set forth in the Resolution of Intention to Annex Territory, and notice of the public hearing was duly given as provided in the Resolution of Intention to Annex Territory; and

WHEREAS, on September 24th, 2013, the Board opened the public hearing at the time and place scheduled and at the public hearing all persons interested, including all taxpayers, property owners and registered voters within the Community Facilities District and within the Additional Territory were given an opportunity to appear and to be heard, and the testimony of all interested persons or taxpayers for or against the proposed annexation or any other matters set forth in the Resolution of Intention to Annex Territory was heard and considered, and the Board then closed the public hearing; and

WHEREAS, on September 24, 2013, the Board adopted its "Resolution Determining to Submit the Question of Annexing Territory to Community Facilities District No. 2006-1 (Fire Protection Service), County of Amador, State of California to the Landowners in the Territory Proposed for Annexation (Annexation No. 8)" (the "Resolution Calling Election"), calling for a special election of the qualified electors within the Additional Territory; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the terms of the Resolution Calling Election and the provisions of the Act, the special election was held on September 24, 2013; and
