



Dear Prospective Poll Worker:

Thank you for your interest in serving as a poll worker in Amador County. Being a poll worker is a great way to serve your community, take an active role in democracy, and become part of the dedicated team working to make the election process easy and accessible to everyone.

To become a poll worker you must meet the following criteria:

- Be at least 18 years of age and a registered voter in California or a high school student at least 16 years of age at the time of the election and in good academic standing, and a U.S. Citizen
- Read and write English
- Available to work on Election Day from approximately 6:00 a.m. until all duties are completed (approximately 10:00 p.m.)
- Be able to attend a training class prior to each election

Poll Workers staff polling places where they are responsible for issuing ballots, assisting voters, and closing the polls after voting concludes at 8:00 p.m. The Inspector is responsible for managing the polling place, picking up the ballots and supplies prior to Election Day, and returning voted ballots and supplies to the Election Department on election night.

Poll workers who work at a polling place are provided a stipend of \$98.00 (for Inspectors) and \$88.00 (for Judges & Clerks) for the day. There is an additional stipend for attending training. Generally a Precinct Board is comprised of one Inspector and one Judge and two to four Clerks.
