- 13. **Planning Department-Appeal by Elton and Laura Allred**: Discussion and possible action relative to a public hearing to consider an appeal filed by Elton and Laura Allred of the Planning Commission's denial of the Allreds' appeal of a staff issued Use Permit for a 50' monopole wireless communications tower. The Planning Commission denied the appeal but amended the Conditions of Approval of the Use Permit to require the proposed monopole tower to be a "monopine" structure with a maximum height of 57' in order to accommodate the "crown" of the "tree". In addition to the monopine structure the project consists of twelve panel wireless antennae, a 30 Kilowatt generator, and related ground-mounted cabinets all located within a 30' x 16' area surrounded by a 6-foot-tall chain-link fence. Project site is located at 19580 American Flat Side Road, approximately one mile south of Fiddletown Road in the Fiddletown area.
- 14. **County Service Area #5 Zone of Benefit 13**: Discussion and possible action relative to a public hearing to consider the formation of Zone of Benefit 13 in County Service Area No. 5, Pine Grove Bluffs, including the roads Mineral Ridge Drive, Bluff Court and Rapini Court; and to conduct assessment ballot proceedings relative to said Zone of Benefit.
