Supervisor Forster stated he requested Item 2- A, B & C be pulled from the Consent Agenda for today's date for discussion because there appeared to be some public concern voiced via social media relative to Item 2C in particular. Supervisor Forster stated he felt it better to pull all of the roll corrections rather than single out one property in particular. Supervisor Forster stated he spoke directly to the County Assessor regarding his concerns and was satisfied with his response. He also advised roll corrections are routinely on the Consent Agenda for approval, however the public is always welcome to contact the Department directly to gain answers to any questions or concerns regarding any item on the Board Agenda.

At this time Mr. Jim Rooney, Assessor, addressed the Board and addressed some of the concerns raised today. He specifically commented on item 2C and stated his Office experienced a system error which resulted in approximately 66 parcels being over assessed. He stated when the error was identified it was immediately corrected. In the case of Item 2C the assessed parcels indicated an 8% increase when in fact they should have been at zero percent as they are vacant, undeveloped parcels.

Lengthy discussion ensued relative to the possibility of including all future roll corrections on the regular agenda for discussion by the full Board. However, it was mentioned that this process would take an exorbitant amount of time for Board members to review and discuss each and every correction. Supervisor Forster suggested Mr. Rooney develop a process such as including a memorandum with each major roll correction that explains the reasoning behind the decrease or increase for Board and public information. Mr. Rooney advised he will discuss this process with staff and report back to the Board at a future meeting.

Amador Community Foundation: Discussion and possible action relative to adoption and presentation of Resolution No. 16-130 to Ms. Kathleen Harmon, Amador Community Foundation, proclaiming Tuesday, November 29, 2016 as Giving Tuesday in Amador County.

Ms. Kathleen Harmon, Amador Community Foundation, addressed the Board and stated the Community Foundation wants to get on board in Amador County with a National Event

known as "Giving Tuesday". Giving Tuesday provides an opportunity for all non-profit organizations, especially those that are very small, to receive donations from donors all over the country and world in some cases. She stated Giving Tuesday started with a simple idea to be a counterpoint to the consumerism of Black Friday and Cyber Monday and this year will mark the fifth anniversary of the event. She continued by noting the Amador Community Foundation participated in Giving Tuesday last year but due to the Butte Fire they did not have a lot of lead time for promotion, however there were a few nonprofits that were able to receive donations. Ms. Harmon noted the Community Foundation does not accept any fees for administering this event and takes care of all the costs associated with advertising and website management. She stated as of now the Foundation has thirty (30) local non-profits on board and she is willing to make contact with others and avail them of the opportunity if the Board has any recommendations.

Amador County Museum: Discussion and possible action relative to approval of a structural addition to the County owned Museum property and possible use of the Wakefield endowment monies bestowed to the Amador County Museum.

Mr. Ed Arata, Amador Historical Society, addressed the Board and reviewed the proposed project with the Board. Proposed diagrams of the project are incorporated in full in the Board packet for today's date.

Mr. John Queirolo addressed the Board and stated he has a collection of eighty five antique (85) horse drawn wagons/carriages and has expressed interest previously to display the carriages in a carriage house to be built on the Museum property. He encouraged the Board to consider this when allocating money to construct new buildings in the future.

MOTION: It was moved by Supervisor Boitano, seconded by Supervisor Morgan and unanimously carried to conceptually approve the construction of a livery stable project and direct staff to prepare a budget modification to release the \$25,000.00 (Wakefield Endowment) from the current Trust to be utilized for the project.

General Services Administration: Delivery of Staff progress report for the Jail Project with discussion and possible action relative to approving the Schematic Design and providing a Notice to Proceed to Nacht & Lewis for Design Development phase, information and funding.

Ms. Christine Poe, General Services, reviewed the staff report relative to this matter which is hereby incorporated into these minutes as though set forth in full.

Mr. Eric Fadnis and Mr. Lorenzo Lopez, Nacht and Lewis, provided a brief presentation relative to the status of the project and the schematic design.

Mr. Chuck Iley, County Administrative Officer, provided a presentation relative to this matter which is hereby incorporated into these minutes as though set forth in full. ?

Planning Department: Discussion and possible action relative to approval of the Chairman's signature on a draft letter responding to the State Board of Forestry and Fire Protection's letter dated August 23, 2016 containing recommendations on the County's draft Safety Element as required by Government Code Section 65302.5 (b)(4).

Mr. John Heissenbuttel, Amador Fire Safe Council, addressed the Board and stated something that might strengthen the letter is incorporating language that states the County has drafted and approved, and Cal Fire is a signatory to, four (4) Community Wildfire Protection Plans that address many of the concerns the Department of Forestry is raising.

Mr. Aaron Brusatori, Community Development Agency Director, addressed the Board and advised due to miscellaneous construction and weather related issues the full road closure will need to continue to November 18, 2016.

PUBLIC HEARING

Planning Department-Scenic Highway Corridor Overlay Zone: Discussion and possible action relative to a public hearing to consider the Planning Commission's recommendation to approve an ordinance establishing a 500' wide Scenic Highway Corridor Overlay District for the purpose of incorporating the existing scenic highway regulations currently contained in the Amador County General Plan into an overlay zone district. The proposed ordinance would apply to the same regulations to the same properties the current regulations apply to which are those properties or portions of properties lying within 250' of the centerline of the paved section of Highway 88 between the Dew Drop Fire Station and the Amador/Alpine County line with the exception of the 500' corridor obtained in either fee title or easement by the US Forest Service described in the Record of Survey recorded in Book 19 of Maps and Plats at Page 1, and described in a deed to the United States of America recorded in Book 36 at Page 295 and Book 39 at Page 391 of the Official Records of Amador County.

Mr. Chuck Beatty, Planning Department, addressed the Board and reviewed the staff report as incorporated in the Board packet for today's date.

Ordinance amending Chapter 19.24 District Regulations by creating a scenic highway corridor overlay zone district for the purpose of incorporating the existing scenic highway development standards and regulations which apply to property located within the Amador County Scenic Highway 88 Corridor into Title 19 Zoning instead of in the Amador County General Plan.

ORDINANCE NO. 1763

Ordinance creating a Scenic Highway Corridor Overlay Zone by amending Sectional Zoning District Maps S-11, U-7, and V-11 pursuant to Section 19.20.020 of the Amador County Code by establishing specific development standards for property located within the Amador County Scenic Highway 88 Corridor.

A review of the proposal was conducted by staff, through their own research who found that the Zone Change will not have a significant effect on the environment and is Categorically Exempt according to Appendix B subsection ©(12), “comparable zonings,” of the Amador County CEQA Guidelines and Section 15305, Class 5, “minor Alterations in Land Use Limitations,” of the State CEQA Guidelines and a Notice of Exemption will be filed with the County Recorder.

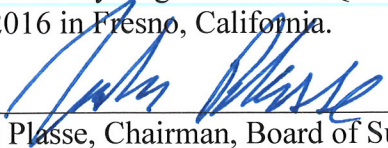
