Subject: Electric Vehicle Charging Stations

At the June 20, 2017, meeting of the Amador Air District's Board of Directors, electric vehicle charging stations (EVCS) were discussed in response to inquiries made of the Amador Air District. After discussion staff was directed to research the following questions:

- 1. How many electric vehicles are there in Amador County, is it possible to get an estimate?
 - ▶ 47 California rebates issued to Amador County since 2010
- 2. How do nearby counties (Calaveras, etc.) handle the cost of electricity, does the user pay for the charge?
 - ▶ All EVCS in El Dorado, Calaveras and Tuolumne do not require the user to pay for the charge.
- 3. What is the best way to site a location? We have discussed sites based upon individual inquires, but should potential sites be considered based upon a need or economic benefit, highway 88 corridor?
 - Information from nearby counties and transportation officials indicate siting EVCS near commercial centers where people have a reason to congregate and where there will be an added economic benefit. Also, there are no EVCS between Jackson and Kirkwood Ski Resort, so a suitable location would be in Pine Grove/Pioneer area.
- 4. Are any transportation funds available for putting in electric vehicle charging stations, ACTC, Amador Transit?
 - Currently no funding is available through transportation agencies.
- 5. Who is liable for accident or injury when using a charging station, how is this handled in nearby counties?
 - ▶ Typically the EVCS site host/property owner is responsible/liable for the equipment.

Recommended Options:

- 1. Direct staff to keep a file and gather information on EVCS for reconsideration at some point in the future.
- 2. Consider a new Amador Air District grant program where the District would provide partial funding to an outside entity who would be responsible for the installation of an EVCS in a District approved location; and the property owner would be responsible for the ongoing electricity costs and liability.
- 3. Discontinue pursuing EVCS as it is not a viable program for the District at this time.
