

## Gentlemen:

In accordance with Section 2279 of the California Food and Agriculture Code, I am pleased to present this 1982 Crop and Livestock Report of Agricultural Production in Amador County.

Amador County's total gross farm crop value for 1982 is estimated to have been \$9,149,100 with timber bringing in an additional \$3,378,000 for a total value of \$12,527,100.

The values in this report are gross values and in no way reflect net gain to the producer. Operational and production costs again increased limiting net income.

Fall rains affected several crops, particularly wine grapes and field corn. The rains delayed harvest of many varieties of wine grapes, lowered expected yield, and in some cases quality. Several hundred acres of field corn still remained in the field as of January 1, 1983.

This report reflects a change in reporting fruit and nut crops. I have separated black and white wine grapes and included non-bearing acreage of all fruit and nut crops.

This report also includes Amador County's timber harvest for the first time. The timber harvest figures dramatically show the impact of the economy on this industry.

I wish to express my appreciation to the many persons and agencies contributing information for the preparation of this report.
