Subject: Rules Update

Attached to this memorandum are staff reports for the Rules Update Redline Revision and for Rule 400 the New Source Rule (NSR). The redline revision and the NSR can be accessed at www.amadorgov.org/services/amador-air-district/air-district-rules. The Air District's permitting engineer, Mr. Ray Kapahi, has reviewed all District rules and updated them where necessary to comply with regulatory changes that have occurred over the years. Two additional updates to the rules include the following and are identified by strikethrough and underline:

1. REGULATION IV Rule 402 EXEMPTIONS TO RULE 401

E. Steam generators, steam superheaters, water boilers, water heaters, and closed heat transfer systems that have a maximum heat input of less than 50,000,000 1,000,000 British Thermal Units (BTU) per hour gross, and are fired with one of the following...

2. REGULATION III Rule 300 OPEN BURNING GENERAL

300.1 <u>Prohibition.</u> Except as otherwise provided in this Regulation, no person shall use open outdoor fires for the purpose of disposal or burning of petroleum wastes, demolition debris, tires, <u>poisonous or toxic</u> trees, <u>shrubs</u>, <u>bushes or plants</u>, wood waste, plastics, or other combustible or flammable solid or liquid waste; or for metal salvage or burning of motor vehicle bodies.

Recommendation: After presentation by Mr. Ray Kapahi, receive any comments from the public and approve the updates to the Amador Air District rules and the new Rule 400.



Adoption of Rule 400 (New Source Review of New and Modified Stationary Sources)

I. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

On March 20, 2018 the Amador Air District Board of Directors will consider adoption of proposed Rule 400 New Source Review (NSR) Rule for New and Modified Major Stationary Sources in the Amador County.

The District is proactively adopting this rule in anticipation that Amador County would be designated as being non-attainment for the federal 8-hour ozone standard in the near future. The 8-hour federal ozone standard is 70 parts per billion and the Amador Air District has a new Design Standard of 71 parts per billion. There have been four exceedances of this standard in 2017 and the expectation is that the District will be designated as non-attainment in the future.

The US Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) has notified the Governor of its intention to re-designate Amador County (EPA letter dated December 20, 2017, copy attached). Therefore, the adoption of this rule would keep the District in compliance with federal requirements that require the adoption of a NSR rule. The Rule applies to any new source in the Amador Air District and once approved will meet the State Implementation Plan (SIP) requirements.

II. BACKGROUND

New Source Review (NSR) is a pre-construction permitting review requirement that ensures that when a new source is built, or when an existing source is modified, the source will minimize emissions consistent with applicable District, state and federal regulations. Based on the pre-construction review, the District issues an Authority to Construct permit for the source. The permit authorizes construction and stipulates conditions designed to minimize emissions and ensure compliance with applicable regulations.

III. DESCRIPTION OF RULE 400, NEW AND MODIFIED MAJOR SOURCES IN AMADOR COUNTY

The District implements a program to evaluate the expected air quality impacts from stationary, portable, and other non-mobile sources. The program is intended to ensure that these sources are constructed and operated in a manner that minimizes air quality



impacts and comply with state and federal regulations. The District's permitting program includes review of preconstruction permits, annual and ongoing regulation of sources through operating permits and applicable emission standards, and regular inspections of these sources to ensure that they comply with all applicable requirements.

Amador County may be designated as a nonattainment area for the federal 2015 8-hour ozone standard of 70 parts per billion in the future. A strategy to control air pollution is to reduce emissions from new or modified existing stationary sources through a New Source Review (NSR) program. The Federal Clean Air Act (CAA) and its associated regulations contain requirements for the District to adopt and implement a State Implementation Plan (SIP)-approved NSR program for any new major stationary source or any major modification located at an existing major stationary source located at facilities in the Amador County.

This rule would apply to sources that emit or have the potential to emit, 100 tons or more per year of volatile organic compounds (VOCs) or nitrogen oxides (NOx). Currently the District has one permitted major sources located in Martel. This rule would apply to new sources; not existing sources.

IV. HEALTH IMPACTS

Ground level ozone is a secondary pollutant formed from photochemical reactions of NOx and volatile organic compounds (VOCs) in the presence of sunlight. Ozone is a strong irritant that adversely affects the human health and damages crops and other environmental resources. As documented by the U.S Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) in the most recent Criteria Document for Ozone (U.S EPA 2006), both short-term and long-term exposure to ozone can irritate and damage the human respiratory system, resulting in:

- Decreased lung function
- Development and aggravation of asthma
- Increased hospitalizations and emergency room visits and
- Premature deaths

V. SOCIOECONOMIC IMPACT AND COST EFFECTIVENESS

HSC Section 40728.5 exempts districts with a population of less than 500,000 persons from the requirement to assess the socioeconomic impacts of proposed rules. Amador County population is below 500,000 persons.

Pursuant to the California Health & Safety Code Section 4090.6(a), the District is required to analyze the cost effectiveness of new rules. The District does not anticipate that any sources will be affected by the proposed regulation and therefore are not subject to the cost effectiveness analysis.

VI. WRITTEN ANALYSIS OF EXISTING FEDERAL AND DISTRICT REGULATIONS

The proposed amended rule does not impose a new emission limit or standard, make an existing emission limit or standard more stringent, or impose new or more stringent monitoring, reporting, or recordkeeping requirements. Pursuant to California Health and Safety Code section 40727.2, subdivision (g), the foregoing satisfies the requirement of a written analysis of existing regulations prior to adopting, amending or repealing a regulation.

VII. ENVIRONMENTAL REVIEW AND COMPLIANCE

Adoption of Rule 2:3c is a regulatory activity, authorized by state statute, to assure the maintenance and protection of the environment, and includes procedures for protection of the environment. This action is therefore categorically exempt from review under the California Environmental Quality Act under the Class 8 Categorical Exemption (Cal. Code Regulations., Title 14, § 15308).

VIII. RULE DEVELOPMENT PROCESS

A Public notice for a public hearing inviting the community to review and comment on the proposed revisions was published in the Amador Ledger Dispatch newspaper, on February 15, 2018, and the Districts website.

A Public Hearing by the Amador Air District Board is scheduled for March 20, 2018, after which if the Rule is approved it will be forwarded to the ARB and US EPA for inclusion into the SIP.

IX. REQUIRED FINDINGS

Section 40727(a) of the California Health & Safety Code (CH&SC) requires that prior to adopting or amending a rule or regulation, an Air Districts makes findings of necessity, authority, clarity, consistency, non-duplication, and reference. The findings must be based on the following:

- 1. Information presented in the written analysis, prepared pursuant to California Health & Safety Code Section 40727.2;
- 2. Information contained in the rulemaking records pursuant to California Health & Safety Code Section 40728; and
- 3. Relevant information presented at the Board's Hearing for adoption of the rule.

The required findings are:

<u>Necessity:</u> Districts with area designated as Nonattainment for federal National Ambient Air Quality Standards (NAAQS) are required by US EPA to establish Federal New Source Review (NSR) Rules for inclusion into the District's State Implementation Plan (SIP).

Currently, the District is designated as being attainment for the 8-hour federal ozone standards. However, recent violation of the ozone standard indicates that attainment status will change.

<u>Authority:</u> The District is authorized to adopt rules and regulations by California Health & Safety Code, Sections 40001, 40702, 40716, 41010, and 41013. (CH&SC 40727(B)(2))

<u>Clarity:</u> District staff has reviewed the proposed rule and determined that it can be easily understood by the affected industry. (CH&SC Section 40727(b)(3))

<u>Consistency:</u> The proposed rule does not conflict with, and is not in contradiction with existing statures, court decisions, or state or federal regulations. (CH&SC Section 40727(b)(4))

<u>Non-Duplication:</u> The proposed rule does not duplicate any state laws or regulations, regarding the attainment and maintenance of state and federal air quality limits. (CH&SC Section 40727(b)(5))

Reference: The District must refer to any statute, court decision, or other provision of law that the District implements, interprets, or makes specific by adopting, amending or repealing the rule.

IX. BOARD ACTIONS AND ALTERNATIVES

Staff requests the Board to do the following:

- a) Hold a Public Hearing to take comments on proposed Rule 400 New Source Review,
 New and Modified Major Sources in Amador County and;
- b) RESOLUTION Request adoption of Amador Air District Rule 400 New Source Review, New and Major Source in Amador County
- c) Propose changes to the text of the amendment to Rule 400 New Source Review, New and Major Sources in Amador County, and re- schedule the public hearing to consider the proposed Rule as revised; or
- d) Take no action.

Dear Governor Brown:

Thank you for your recommendation dated October 3, 2016, on air quality designations for the revised 2015 National Ambient Air Quality Standards (NAAQS) for ozone throughout California. I appreciate the information California shared with the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) as we move forward to improve ozone air quality. This letter is to notify you of the EPA's preliminary response to California's recommendations and to inform you of our approach for completing designations for the revised ozone standards. After considering California's October 3, 2016 ozone designation recommendations, which were based on 2013-2015 air quality data, as well as other relevant technical information, the EPA intends to agree with the State's recommendation and designate the areas listed in Enclosure 1 as Nonattainment. The EPA also intends to designate all other areas in the State not previously designated in November 2017 as Attainment/Unclassifiable.

On October 1, 2015, the EPA lowered the primary 8-hour ozone standard from 0.075 parts per million (ppm) to 0.070 ppm to provide increased protection of public health. The EPA revised the secondary 8-hour ozone standard, making it identical to the primary standard, to protect against welfare effects, including impacts on sensitive vegetation and forested ecosystems. Working closely with the states and tribes, the EPA is implementing the standards using a common sense approach that improves air quality and minimizes the burden on state and local governments. As part of this routine process, the EPA is working with the states to identify areas in the country that meet the standards and those that need to take steps to reduce ozone pollution.

As a first step in implementing the 2015 ozone standards, the EPA asked states to submit in the fall of 2016 their designation recommendations, including appropriate area boundaries. A first round of designations was published on November 16, 2017. Consistent with states' recommendations, the EPA designated most of the country as Attainment/Unclassifiable, with limited areas designated as Unclassifiable. Further, consistent with EPA's "Policy for Establishing Separate Air Quality Designations for Areas of Indian Country" (December 20, 2011), the EPA designated two areas of Indian country as separate Attainment/Unclassifiable areas.

As required by the Clean Air Act, the EPA will designate an area as Nonattainment if there are certified, quality-assured air quality monitoring data showing a violation of the 2015 ozone standards or if the EPA makes a determination that the area is contributing to a violation of the standards in a nearby area.

Areas designated Attainment/Unclassifiable are not measuring or contributing to a violation of the standards.

A Technical Support Document, available on the EPA ozone designations website at www.epa.gov/ozone-designations/, provides a detailed analysis to support our preliminary decisions for the areas of the State not previously designated. In order for the EPA to consider more current (i.e., 2015-2017) air quality data in the final designation decisions for any area, California must submit certified, quality-assured 2015-2017 air quality monitoring data for the area to the EPA by February 28. 2018.

The EPA will continue to work with state officials regarding the appropriate boundaries for the Nonattainment areas in California. If California has additional information that you would like the EPA to consider, please submit it to us by February 28, 2018. Please submit additional information by sending it to the EPA's public docket for these designations, EPA-HQ-OAR-2017-0548, located at www.regulations.gov, and sending a copy to EPA Region 9. The EPA will also make its preliminary designation decisions and supporting documentation available to the general public for review and comment. We will be announcing a 30-day public comment period shortly in the Federal Register. After considering additional information we receive, the EPA plans to promulgate final ozone designations in the spring of 2018.

The EPA is committed to working with the states and tribes to reduce ozone air pollution. We look forward to a continued dialogue with you and your staff as we work together to implement the 2015 ozone standards. 

ADOPTION OF PROPOSED UPDATES TO DISTRICT RULES AND REGULATIONS

I. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

On March 20, 2018 the Amador Air District (AAD) Board of Directors will consider adoption of proposed updates of District Rules and Regulations for New and Modified Major Stationary Sources in the Amador County.

Current District rules do not cover a variety of changes that have occurred in state and federal air quality regulations in the past three decades. These proposed changes cover, in part, inclusion of new air pollutants, new definitions of regulated air pollutants, new air quality standards and the name of the District. The proposed changes do not impose any new requirements on current or future emission sources. Rather, the updated rules clarify the District's and permit applicant's obligation in complying with state and federal requirements.

II. BACKGROUND

District rules have not been updated for the past 20 years. Some rules date back to the 1970s. During this period, there have been changes in the local air quality, new air quality standards have been promulgated and new air pollutants have been identified by the US Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and the California Air Resources Board (CARB).

Since compliance with federal and state air quality regulations have been delegated to AAD, it is important for the District to maintain an updated set of rules so that it can meet its obligations. Another consequence is that lax and outdated Rules encourage polluting industries to locate in the County. Sources that could not be permitted in adjacent counties (Sacramento, San Joaquin) could be permitted in Amador County. As a result, disproportionately higher emissions would occur in the County for the same types of sources.



III. SUMMARY OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGES

The following updates to the District rules are proposed:

IV. HEALTH IMPACTS

The proposed rule changes affect the release of ozone precursors (VOCs and NOx) as well as fine particulate (PM-2.5). Ground level ozone is a secondary pollutant formed from photochemical reactions of NOx and volatile organic compounds (VOCs) in the presence of sunlight. Ozone is a strong irritant that adversely affects the human health and damages crops and other environmental resources. As documented by the U.S Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) in the most recent Criteria Document for Ozone (U.S EPA 2006), both short-term and long-term exposure to ozone can irritate and damage the human respiratory system, resulting in:

- Decreased lung function
- Development and aggravation of asthma
- Increased hospitalizations and emergency room visits and
- Premature deaths

In addition to ozone, fine particulate (PM-10 and PM-2.5) are known to impair lung function, especially in the younger and older segments of the population.

V. SOCIOECONOMIC IMPACT AND COST EFFECTIVENESS

HSC Section 40728.5 exempts districts with a population of less than 500,000 persons from the requirement to assess the socioeconomic impacts of proposed rules. Amador County population is below 500,000 persons.

Pursuant to the California Health & Safety Code Section 4090.6(a), the District is required to analyze the cost effectiveness of new rules. The District does not anticipate that any sources will be affected by the proposed regulation and therefore are not subject to the cost effectiveness analysis.

VI. WRITTEN ANALYSIS OF EXISTING FEDERAL AND DISTRICT REGULATIONS

The proposed amended rules do not impose a new emission limit or standard, make an existing emission limit or standard more stringent, or impose new or more stringent monitoring, reporting, or recordkeeping requirements. Pursuant to California Health and Safety Code section 40727.2, subdivision (g), the foregoing satisfies the requirement of a written analysis of existing regulations prior to adopting, amending or repealing a regulation.

VII. ENVIRONMENTAL REVIEW AND COMPLIANCE

Adoption of Rule 2:3c is a regulatory activity, authorized by state statute, to assure the maintenance and protection of the environment, and includes procedures for protection of the environment. This action is therefore categorically exempt from review under the California Environmental Quality Act under the Class 8 Categorical Exemption (Cal. Code Regulations., Title 14, § 15308).

VIII. RULE DEVELOPMENT PROCESS

A Public notice for a public hearing inviting the community to review and comment on the proposed revisions was published in the Amador Ledger Dispatch newspaper, on February 15, 2018, and the Districts website.

A Public Hearing by the Amador Air District Board is scheduled for March 20, 2018, after which if the Rule is approved it will be forwarded to the ARB and US EPA for inclusion into the SIP.

IV. REQUIRED FINDINGS

Section 40727(a) of the California Health & Safety Code (CH&SC) requires that prior to adopting or amending a rule or regulation, an Air District makes findings of necessity, authority, clarity, consistency, non-duplication, and reference. The findings must be based on the following:

- 1. Information presented in the written analysis, prepared pursuant to California Health & Safety Code Section 40727.2;
- 2. Information contained in the rulemaking records pursuant to California Health & Safety Code Section 40728; and
- 3. Relevant information presented at the Board's Hearing for adoption of the rule.

The required findings are:

Necessity: In order to carry out its obligation to enforce the federal and state air quality regulations, AAD needs to have an updated set of rules and regulations. The proposed rule changes provide District staff with the enforcement tools needed to carry out its mandate.

<u>Authority:</u> The District is authorized to adopt rules and regulations by California Health & Safety Code, Sections 40001, 40702, 40716, 41010, and 41013. (CH&SC 0727(B)(2))

<u>Clarity:</u> District staff has reviewed the proposed rules and determined that it can be easily understood by the affected industry. (CH&SC Section 40727(b)(3))

<u>Consistency:</u> The proposed rule does not conflict with, and is not in contradiction with existing statures, court decisions, or state or federal regulations. (CH&SC Section 40727(b)(4))

Non-Duplication: The proposed rule does not duplicate any state laws or regulations, regarding the attainment and maintenance of state and federal air quality limits. (CH&SC Section 40727(b)(5))

Reference: The District must refer to any statute, court decision, or other provision of law that the District implements, interprets, or makes specific by adopting, amending or repealing the rule.

IX. BOARD ACTIONS AND ALTERNATIVES:

Staff requests the Board to do the following:

- a) Hold a Public Hearing to take comments on proposed updates to District Rules and Regulations, New Source Review, New and Modified Major Sources in Amador County and;
- b) RESOLUTION Request adoption of Amador Air District updates to District Rules and Regulations, New Source Review, New and Major Source in Amador County
- c) Propose changes to the text of the amendment to updates to District Rules and Regulations, New Source Review, New and Major Sources in Amador County, and reschedule the public hearing to consider the proposed Rule as revised; or
- d) Take no action

Subject: Draft Budget for FY 2018-2019

Attached to this memorandum is the Amador Air District's draft 2018/2019 Budget. The general approach to the budget has been similar to past budgets where the expenses match the revenues, with the exception of the special projects. The special project expenses are funded as a draw from reserve to help slowly and judiciously reduce the reserve level. The draft budget includes the following:

- One-time Carl Moyer Grant to Timber Products Company/Ampine of \$94.540 (revenue) and \$79,540 (expense), with the difference, \$15,000, in administrative funds to the Air District. Because these are one-time funds they were not shown on the approved 2017/2018 budget and they were not considered in the draft 2018/2019 budget.
- 2. \$7,000 has been included in the draft 2018/2019 budget for part-time temporary staff.
- 3. The Smoke Reduction Bin Program has been capped at \$55,000 in agreement with ACES Waste Services proposal to the Air District.
- 4. A 5% increase has been added to all Salaries and Wages lines as an estimate of budget changes to these categories.
- 5. Special Projects are budgeted at \$65,000. \$15,000 of which will be used for the previously approved Electric Vehicle Charging Station pilot project; and \$50,000 for a possible second round of the Woodstove Changeout Program. The Woodstove Changeout Program will be brought back to the next meeting for consideration and possible approval.

Recommendation: Direct staff to bring back a final budget for public hearing at the next meeting of the Amador Air District Board of Directors.

Subject: Smoke Reduction Bin Program (Pine Needle Bins)

At the January 16, 2018, meeting of the Amador Air District's Board of Directors, staff was directed to come back to today's meeting with solutions to the previously discussed issues and a plan for managing the Smoke Reduction (Pine Needle) Bin Program.

Key Issues Regarding Pine Needle Bin Program:

- Developed in an ad-hoc committee to utilize excess cash reserve
- Air District program intended to reduce smoke from outdoor burning
- Program has been well-received and appreciated by county residents
- Not intended to be for commercial/professional companies
- Tree mortality problem has increased green waste volumes
- Silver Drive bin site has been problematic with dumping
- Outdoor burning usually occurs between November and June, however pine needle bin program is from May through October
- Smoke nuisance complaints persist during burning season
- Annual fiscal year budget has been \$70,000
- Vicini Brothers Green Waste Recycling Facility cannot accept pine needles
- Disposal costs at out-of-county facility will double, however ACES has offered to cap costs at \$55,000 and/or waive haul charges
- Remaining budget for 2017/18 will run out in June or July

Problems to be Addressed:

- a) Facility capable of accepting pine needles
- b) Silver Drive issues
- c) Reduce smoke complaints during burning season
- d) Cost control

Recommendation:

- 1. a. Discontinue Silver Drive and relocate to Mace Meadows location
 - b. Authorize staff to expend remaining 17/18 funds (approx. \$20,000) during May and June at permanent locations: Lockwood Fire Department, Mace Meadows, Pine Acres, and Sutter Creek Fire Department
- 2. Temporarily suspend program from July 2018 through October 2018
- 3. a. Change program to run November through June, during burning season
 - b. Authorize FY 2018/19 budget for Pine Needle Bin Program at \$55,000 (amount capped by ACES) to include permanent locations and neighborhood locations

Electric Vehicle Charging Station Pilot Program

The Electric Vehicle Charging Station (EVCS) pilot program is an Amador Air District grant program that offers grant funding to assist with the installation of new EVCS's. The following information is provided to give you an overview of what is necessary for the installation of an EVCS at your location. Grantee's responsibilities include the following:

- ⇒ Installation, Parts, Repairs and Maintenance: The EVCS will require installation by a licensed electrical professional. Some items that need to be considered in the installation cost are tying into the available electrical power/panel, trenching and conduit from the panel to the charging system, and equipment cost.
- ⇒ **Permitting, ADA, etc.:** It is the responsibility of the grantee to meet all permitting requirements at the location where the EVCS will be installed. If you have any questions please contact your city and/or county building department. Compliance with all applicable laws and regulations including the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) is the responsibility of the grantee.
- ⇒ **Operational Costs:** The grantee is responsible for all ongoing costs including electricity required to maintain the EVCS operational.
- ⇒ **Public Access:** The EVCS is required to be open and accessible for public use; and cannot be locked or otherwise taken out of use.
- ⇒ **Liability:** Grantee assumes total liability for all program costs throughout the life of the program and the Amador Air District maintains no liability related to EVCS or its use.
- ⇒ **Term:** Grantee agrees to keep the EVCS operational for a minimum of seven (7) years from the date of completed installation.

It is the grantee's responsibility to successfully complete all required components of the EVCS Pilot Program. The Amador Air District is available for consultation, but is not responsible for the project completion. Grant funds will be recovered by the grantee after all paid receipts of expenditure are received, and a project completion inspection is performed by District personnel. The District will reimburse the applicant up to \$5,000 of associated project costs. Any upgrades to the location that do not pertain to the specific EVCS project are the grantee's responsibility.

GRANTEE REQUIREMENTS:

- 1. Sign below to acknowledge program requirements and return to the District.
- 2. Call the District to discuss the location, estimated costs, and time frame of the EVCS installation.
- Obtain pre-authorization from District confirming the equipment meets the program requirements.
- 4. Purchase and install equipment and provide proof to the District that the equipment has been paid in full.
- 5. Call District for a completion inspection of new equipment.



The Electric Vehicle Charging Station (EVCS) pilot program is an Amador Air District grant program that offers grant funding to assist with the installation of new EVCS's. The following information is provided to give you an overview of what is necessary for the installation of an EVCS at your location. Grantee's responsibilities include the following:

- Installation, Parts, Repairs and Maintenance: The EVCS will require installation by a licensed electrical professional. Some items that need to be considered in the installation cost are tying into the available electrical power/panel, trenching and conduit from the panel to the charging system, and equipment cost.
- Permitting, ADA, etc.: It is the responsibility of the grantee to meet all permitting requirements at the location where the EVCS will be installed. If you have any questions please contact your city and/or county building department. Compliance with all applicable laws and regulations including the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) is the responsibility of the grantee.
- Department Costs: The grantee is responsible for all ongoing costs including electricity required to maintain the EVCS operational.
- Public Access: The EVCS is required to be open and accessible for public use; and cannot be locked or otherwise taken out of use.
- ➡ Liability: Grantee assumes total liability for all program costs throughout the life of the program and the Amador Air District maintains no liability related to EVCS or its use.
- ⇒ Term: Grantee agrees to keep the EVCS operational for a minimum of seven (7) years from the date of completed installation.

It is the grantee's responsibility to successfully complete all required components of the EVCS Pilot Program. The Amador Air District is available for consultation, but is not responsible for the project completion. Grant funds will be recovered by the grantee after all paid receipts of expenditure are received, and a project completion inspection is performed by District personnel. The District will reimburse the applicant up to \$5,000 of associated project costs. Any upgrades to the location that do not pertain to the specific EVCS project are the grantee's responsibility.

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- 5. Call District for a completion inspection of new equipment.
- 6. Upon completion of the above steps, the District will reimburse 100% of the cost of the new equipment and installation, up to a maximum of \$5,000.00.
