- \$1,000,000--County Community Fund
- \$92,880--Amador County Unified School District
- \$1,429,200—Traffic Mitigation Fee
- \$250,000—Trust Fund for Noise Inhibiting Improvements (residential)
- \$1,164,000—Renovation of JVFD Station 171
- \$20,301.75—CHP (through 4/29/19)
- \$570,942--Sheriff (First quarterly payment)

To Be Paid During Construction (Based upon ISA Estimated Costs)

- \$4,300,000—Signalization work
- \$5,025,109—Road improvements
- \$27,000—Traffic calming along Jackson Valley Road
- \$5,420,829—Fire

To Be Paid at Commencement of Casino (Based upon ISA Estimated Costs)

- \$150,000—Gambling/Substance Abuse
