• The January 2019 final PIT count numbers were shared with the group. The number of homeless persons has increased from 149 in 2017 to 214 in 2019. This represents an increase of 65 additional homeless people or a 40% increase.

3. Homeless Resource Fair Summary

An update was given by Michele Siefer and Larry Nunez from Victory Village. A total of 56 homeless individuals were contacted in an age range 9-68 yrs with an average age of 47 yrs old.
