Hi, Nancy. The State Map Act gives subdivisions a three-year life span from the time the tentative map is approved to complete all required infrastructure improvements and get the final map recorded. The County is able to extend the expiration date up to six years, and the State can grant extensions, as well.

In Martin Point's case, the original map was approved by the Board of Supervisors in 2007 and would have expired in 2010. The County extended the expiration date six years, the State extended it three years, and it expired in 2019. So, now, the project has to be resubmitted and approved in order to get a new threeyear entitlement window. The resubmitted project is the same as the original, 33 single-family lots and 1 duplex lot.

Two other projects, Timber Creek townhomes and Palisades subdivision, had similar expiration issues and were re-approved. Thunder Mountain Lodge also expired, but hasn't re-applied.
