Attached to this memorandum is our Rule 428 Emission Statement staff report. A copy of the rule was posted to the Amador Air District (AAD) site and can be accessed at https://www.amadorgov.org/services/amador-air-district/public-notice. The Air District's permitting engineer, Ray Kapahi, has reviewed the rule for accuracy.

Rule 428 Emission Statement implements Section 182(a)(3)(B) of the federal Clean Air Act (CAA) requiring all ozone nonattainment areas to have a rule or program in place that requires emissions statements from stationary sources emitting quantities of oxides of nitrogen (NOx) or volatile organic compounds (VOC) over 25 tons per year annually. This CAA section also requires the owner or operator of each stationary source subject to this rule to report and certify the accuracy of their reported NOx and VOC emissions and/or data.

There are three sources that are affected by this rule. All three sources have been notified and AAD Staff have met with each source to explain this rule and what it means to them.

Recommendation: Receive any comments from the public and approve resolution 21-02 adopting Rule 428 – Emissions Statement and authorize the Air Pollution Control Officer to submit said rule to the California Air Resources Board (CARB) for subsequent submittal to EPA pursuant to Title I of the Federal Clean Air Act and for incorporation into the District's Infrastructure State Implementation Program (SIP) .

I. BACKGROUND

Proposed Rule 428 implements Section 182(a)(3)(B) of the federal Clean Air Act (CAA) requiring all ozone nonattainment areas to have a rule or program in place that requires emissions statements from stationary sources emitting quantities of oxides of nitrogen (NOx) or volatile organic compounds (VOC) over 25 tons per year annually. This CAA section also requires the owner or operator of each stationary source subject to this rule to report and certify the accuracy of their reported NOx or VOC emissions and/or data.

This section also allows air agencies to waive the requirements of Rule 428 for stationary sources emitting less than 25 tons per year of NOx or VOC if the State provides an inventory of emissions from such category of sources, based on the use of Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) accepted emissions factors. This is achieved by the California Air Resources Board (ARB) submitting periodic inventories to EPA on behalf of all the nonattainment areas in California.

The emissions statements requirements for the 2015 .070 ppm 8-hour ozone standard are described in *Implementation of the 2015 National Ambient Air Quality Standards for Ozone (O3 NAAQS): Nonattainment Area State Implementation Plan Requirements* (83 FR 62998, December 6, 2018). The Amador Air District (District) had not previously adopted an emissions statement rule and pursuant to Section 182(a)(3)(B), this rule is required to be adopted within two (2) years after the date of the enactment 2015 O3 NAAQS. The first emissions statements shall be submitted within three (3) years after enactment of the 2015 O3 NAAQS and will cover calendar year of 2021.

II. DISCUSSION:

The purpose of proposed Rule 428 is to establish a program that requires emissions statements from stationary sources emitting greater than 25 tons per year of NOx or VOCs meeting the statutory requirements of CAA Section 182(a)(3)(B). This is a new rule that will be incorporated into the District's Infrastructure State Implementation Program (SIP).

Actual emissions information or data will be a requirement for all applicable permitted stationary sources. All documents submitted on an annual basis will be required to be signed and dated, certifying the information being submitted is accurate to the best knowledge of the responsible person certifying the reports. At a minimum, the emissions statement will show actual emissions or operational data allowing the District to estimate actual emissions from that source. Emissions calculations shall be based on emissions factors approved by EPA and the Air Pollution Control Officer (APCO). The emissions statement shall be on a form or file format specified by the APCO.

There are three stationary sources that emit greater than 25 tons per year of NOx or VOCs subject to the proposed rule using calendar year 2018 emissions information: Ampine: A Division of Timber Products Company (NOx and VOC), George Reed, Inc. (NOx) and Specialty Granules (NOx).

III. IMPACTS OF THE PROPOSED RULE

A. Emissions Impact

Proposed Rule 428 is a federal administrative rule and does not have a direct impact on emissions. It is expected that emissions of stationary sources subject to this rule will not substantially change.

B. Cost Effectiveness

CH&SC Section 40703 requires the District, in the process of the adoption of any rule or regulation, to consider and make public its findings related to the cost effectiveness of the rule. Cost effectiveness for rulemaking purposes is calculated by dividing the cost of the air pollution controls required by the rule by the amount of air pollution reduced. The proposed new rule will not directly impact emissions and therefore cost effectiveness calculations cannot be performed.

C. Fiscal Impacts

Proposed Rule 428 may impose additional costs on those stationary sources that are required to comply with this rule. Currently, all stationary sources are required to supply operational data for the District to perform emissions calculations. The District may request those sources subject to this rule perform calculations rather than just supply data. There will be no annual permit fee amendment for purposes of this rule.

D. Socioeconomic Impacts

No socioeconomic impact analysis is required pursuant to CH&SC Section 40728.5(d). Districts with a population of less than 500,000 persons are exempt from this provision.

IV. ENVIRONMENTAL REVIEW / CEQA

A. Stationary sources subject to this rule are required to obtain operating permits through the District pursuant to the CAA and the California Health and Safety Code. The proposed rule only adds additional reporting requirements which would not create any potential adverse environmental impacts.

Consistent with the above criteria, District staff finds that the proposed rule is exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) for the following reasons: 1) it can be seen with certainty that there is no possibility that the activities associated with this rule may have a potential adverse effect on the environment; and 2) the action being taken with the adoption of this rule by a regulatory agency for protection of the environment is considered a categorical exemption (Class 8 Categorical Exemption, CEQA Guidelines § 15308).

V. REGULATORY FINDINGS

Section 40727(a) of the California Health and Safety Code requires that prior to adopting, amending, or repealing a rule or regulation, the district board shall make findings of necessity, authority, clarity, consistency, nonduplication, and reference. These findings are as follows:

A. Purpose

This Rule establishes the requirements for the submittal from specified stationary sources in accordance with the requirements of the 1990 Clean Air Act Section 182(a)(3)(B).

B. Applicability

The requirements of this Rule are applicable to any stationary source emitting 25 or more tons per year of oxides of nitrogen (NOx) or volatile organic compounds (VOC).

C. Definitions

- 1. Actual Emissions: Measured or estimated emissions which most accurately represent the emissions from an emissions unit, including fugitive emissions.
- 2. Emissions Statement Information Request: An annual information request form by the APCO to each affected source subject to this Rule for emissions data, including but not limited to, actual emissions or operational data allowing the District to estimate actual emissions.
- 3. Volatile Organic Compounds (VOCs): Reactive Organic Compounds (ROCs), and Reactive Organic Gases (ROGs) are any compound of carbon, excluding carbon monoxide, carbon dioxide, carbonic acid, metallic carbides or carbonates, and ammonium carbonate, which participates in atmospheric photochemical reactions.
- 4. Responsible Official: An individual who is responsible for the data presented in the emissions statement, and who accepts legal responsibility for the emission statement's accuracy. The responsible official is liable to legal review, or in case of fault, to penalties.

D. Requirements

- 1. The owner or operator of any stationary source that is subject to this Rule shall provide the Amador Air District (District) with a written emissions statement showing actual emissions or operational data allowing the District to estimate actual emissions from that source.
- 2. The emissions statement shall be on a form (Emissions Statement Information Request) or in a format specified by the APCO and shall contain emissions or data for the time period specified by the APCO. Emissions statements shall be submitted annually.

3. The owner or operator of the stationary source shall maintain records for a period of up to five years from the date of submittal. All records shall be submitted indicating the nature and amounts of emissions from that source and/or any other information as may be necessary or requested by the APCO to determine whether such source is in compliance with applicable emissions limitations, control measures, and permit conditions.

E. Administrative Requirements

1. District Requirements

- a. The APCO may waive the requirements of Section D of this Rule to any class or category of stationary sources which emit less than 25 tons per year of NOx or VOCs if the District provides the California Air Resources Board (ARB) with an emissions inventory of sources emitting less than 25 tons per year of NOx or VOCs, based on the use of emissions factors established by or other methods acceptable to the EPA.
- b. All official documents submitted to the District shall contain a certification signed and dated by a responsible official of the company attesting that the information contained in the submitted documents is accurate to the best knowledge of the individual certifying the submission. The requirements of this Section apply to, but are not limited to, the emission statement required in Section D of this Rule.

2. Failure to Submit

- a. A failure by a responsible official to submit an Emissions Statement by the date required, shall be deemed a willful failure to furnish information required to disclose the nature and quantity of emissions discharged by the stationary source. In such case, the APCO may take action in the form of the following:
 - i. The APCO may suspend the Permit(s) of such source.
 - ii. The APCO shall serve notice in writing of such suspension and the reasons for the suspension upon the permittee.
 - iii. The APCO will reinstate the suspended Permit(s) when furnished with the required information.
 - iv. The APCO may choose as an alternative to suspending the Permit, to levy a monetary penalty of \$500 per day until furnished with the required information. The APCO may waive this penalty for reasons beyond the responsible official's control.

Proposed Rule 428 implements Section 182(a)(3)(B) of the federal Clean Air Act (CAA) requiring all ozone nonattainment areas to have a rule or program in place that requires emissions statements from stationary sources emitting quantities of oxides of nitrogen (NOx) or volatile organic compounds (VOC) over 25 tons per year annually. This is a new rule that will be incorporated into the District's Infrastructure State Implementation Program (SIP).

Whereas, Amador County has been designated nonattainment for the 2015 8-hour Ozone National Ambient Air Quality Standard; and

Whereas, federal ozone nonattainment areas are required to adopt State Implementation Plan (SIP) elements pursuant to Section 110(a) of the federal Clean Air Act (CAA); and

Whereas, Section 182(a)(3)(B) of the CAA required all federal ozone nonattainment areas to require emissions statements to be submitted annually from stationary sources that emit over 25 tons per year of NOx or VOCs; and

Whereas, proposed Rule 428 – Emissions Statement meets the criteria of section 128(a)(3)(B) for those stationary sources subject and fulfills the requirements of the CAA provisions; and

Whereas, the Amador Air District Board has determined that the proposed rule is in harmony with, and not in conflict with or contradictory to, existing statutes, court decisions, or State or federal requirements pursuant to California Health and Safety Code Section 40727(b)(4); and

Whereas, the Amador Air District Board has determined that Rule 428 once adopted is to be submitted to the U.S. EPA for inclusion in the SIP; and

Whereas, the Amador Air District staff conducted a public workshop on DATE to receive comments from the public on the proposed rule; and

Whereas, following a 30-day public hearing notice posted on DATE, the Amador Air District Board conducted a public hearing on March 16, 2020 at 1:30pm to provide for public comment and adoption of Rule 428 – Emissions Statement; and

In 2018, the Amador Air District (AAD) created a grant pilot program offering \$5000.00 to install electric vehicle charging stations in each of the five incorporated cities in Amador County. Letters were sent out to each of the City's managers. At the time, AAD received three letters back with interest in participation. Within the year, two of the Cities decided that they no longer wanted to participate. The only City that has kept working on moving their project forward has been Amador City. It's been a slow process but they are still trying to get this project through to completion.

Currently, Amador City is working with Breakeven Brewers who are establishing themselves in Amador City and are navigating through their electrical needs. Since they are already working with PG&E and an electrical contractor to spec out the costs and enhancements they need, Amador City Officials are working to see if they can have the EV chargers installed at Breakeven Brewers location and use their electrical. The costs for entry from both a PG&E expansion and the EV service provider are pretty expensive. Installation, PG&E, and the EV service provider are estimated to be close to \$20,000.

Amador City is requesting the Board to consider increasing their grant amount to \$10,000. This would help off-set some of the costs for the Brewers and allow for the city to not pay the electric. As well Amador City is evaluating having a two vehicle charging station as opposed to a single one.

Recommendation: Provide Staff direction on the City of Amador City's request.

At the January 19, 2021 Board meeting, Staff was directed to bring this agenda item back to allow the formed Ad Hoc Committee time to meet and discuss possible recommendations in regards to the loan the Amador Air District (AAD) made to Vicini Brothers, LLC (Vicini) to help purchase a replacement grinder.

The Ad Hoc Committee was comprised of Director Forster and Director Oneto. The Air Pollution Control Officer, Herminia Perry and Glenn Spitzer, Deputy County Counsel also attended these meetings.

Based on information gathered from Kathy Vicini and Paul Molinelli Jr. (Vicini and ACES Waste Services, respectively), members of the Ad Hoc Committee have concerns that if this loan is not forgiven in its full amount the Vicini Brothers, LLC may potentially go out of business. The spreadsheet attached was provided by Paul Molinelli, Jr, showing the current disposal cost and what they would be if Vicini was no longer operating and ACES Waste Services was required to take all green waste exclusively to Sierra Wood Waste in Sacramento.

Recommendation: Ad Hoc committee recommends forgiving the loan in its full amount.

Summary:

On September 5, 2018, the Amador Air District (AAD) loaned \$100,000 to the Vicini Brothers, LLC, to facilitate the company's purchase of a 2012 Vermeer HG4000 Horizontal Grinder, which was required to meet "Tier 4" air regulation requirements. The AAD will now consider forgiving all or a portion of the loan obligation.

The AAD sought guidance on the rule prohibiting the gifting of public funds. This memorandum sets forth the rule and provides general analysis and guidance on the issue.

Rule: If funds are used for a public purpose, then they are not considered a gift of public funds.

By its terms, article XVI, section 6 of the California Constitution prevents legislative bodies from making or authorizing any gift of public funds for private purposes. "The term 'gift' in the constitutional provision 'includes all appropriations of public money for which there is no authority or enforceable claim,' even if there is a moral or equitable obligation." (*Sturgeon v. County of Los Angeles* (2008) 167 Cal.App.4th 630, 637.)

"It is well settled that the primary question to be considered in determining whether an appropriation of public funds is to be considered a gift is whether the funds are to be used for a public or private purpose. If they are to be used for a public purpose, they are not a gift within the meaning of this constitutional prohibition." (*Jordan v. Department of Motor Vehicles* (2002) 100 Cal.App.4th 431, 450.) Importantly, "[t]he determination of what constitutes a public purpose is primarily a matter for the Legislature, and its discretion will not be disturbed by the courts so long as that determination has a reasonable basis." (*County of Alameda v. Carleson* (1971) 5 Cal.3d 730, 746.)

Analysis: If the Amador Air District has a reasonable basis for determining that loan forgiveness serves the public interest, then it does not constitute a gift of public funds.

So long as the AAD has a reasonable basis for determining the forgiveness of the loan or a portion of it serves the public interest, then it does not constitute a gift of public funds even if it also provides a private benefit. For example, if based on the evidence presented to the Board, the Board concludes that the loan obligation creates a probability of a disruption to—or a significant increase in cost of—a public service, then the Board would have a reasonable basis for determining that the loan forgiveness constitutes a public purpose and not a gift of public funds. (Sturgeon v. County of Los Angeles (2008) 167 Cal.App.4th 630, 637-638.)

If the Board concludes the loan forgiveness serves the public interest, the Board should articulate its reasoning with references to evidence in the record.
