

Report of Tree Service,

In reviewing the property at 940 Columbine Circle the owner pointed out a six hazard trees located immediately next to the house. I have listed the trees and the issue with each tree. Tree 1 (lodgepole): Located 9 feet from the roof (hazard tree) south side Tree 2 (lodgepole): Located 9 feet from the roof (hazard tree) south side Tree 3 (lodgepole): Diseased (western gull rust and cankers)

Tree 4 (lodgepole): Diseased (western gull rust and cankers)

Tree 5 (red fir): Located 4 feet from roof (hazard tree) south west corner of house Tree 5 (lodgepole): Located 9 feet from roof (hazard tree) north side of house

There are 8 small trees <8 inches in diameter growing too close to larger trees that need to be removed. None of the trees identified are a visual screen from Hwy 88 and removal of the trees will not impact the the tree screening from Hwy 88 or from other neighbors.

The owner would like to have the trees removed when there is sufficient snow on the ground to mitigate any soil disturbance.

Work Description:

Left side of home tree;

- Lodge Pole 34" DBH, remove due to Canker defect on tree.
- Lodge Pole 24" DBH, remove due to canker defect on tree.
- Lodge Pole 30" DBH, remove for defensible space.

Back of home:

- Lodge Pole 18" DBH, remove for defensible space.
- White Fir 14" DBH, remove for defensible space.

Right side of home.

• Lodge Pole 24" DBH, remove for defensible space.

Chip all resulting debris and haul away. Leave logs on ground in 6' lengths. Cut stumps to 6" or less above ground level.
