## Amador COVID-19 Update

**Amador County, CA** – Amador County Public Health reports 7 more cases of COVID-19 since last Tuesday's update, bringing the total laboratory confirmed case count to 1,801. The new cases include 3 males and 4 females, 3 aged 18-49, 3 aged 50-64, 1 age 65 and above; 2 residing in Lone, 2 in Jackson, 1 in Pioneer, 1 living in Plymouth, and 1 residing in Sutter Creek/Amador City.

This week, Amador County remains in the least restrictive yellow (minimal risk) tier within [California's Blueprint for a Safer Economy](#). Businesses and events may reference California's Blueprint for Safer Economy [Activity and Business Tiers chart](#) for the latest guidance by tier and sector. California [masking guidance](#) remains in place.

When California shifts to the [Beyond the Blueprint](#) framework, on June 15, 2021, the state plans to re-open the economy. [Industry and Sector Questions and Answers](#) are accessible on the California Department of Public Health (CDPH) website, along with the current [CDPH and CalOSHA guidance](#) on indoor environments. Employers will still be subject to the [Cal/OSHA COVID-19 Prevention Emergency Temporary Standards \(ETS\)](#), if applicable to them, and CDPH will continue to provide updated guidance for high-risk settings.

Over 31,500 doses of vaccine have been administered to Amador residents to date. Upcoming Amador County Public Health COVID-19 vaccine clinics are updated on the Amador COVID-19 vaccine information page: <https://www.amadorgov.org/services/covid-19>. Pfizer COVID-19 vaccine eligibility expanded to include those age 12 and above. Information on the different types of COVID-19 vaccines, age eligibility, and how each vaccine works is available on the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) website: <https://www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/vaccines/different-vaccines.html>.

If you missed your second dose appointment there are multiple options for COVID-19 vaccination within the county and surrounding areas. The next [Amador Public Health](#) vaccine clinic is this Friday, June 4, 2021, from 10 am to 3 pm. To find a COVID-19 vaccine appointment at nearby pharmacies, visit the [Vaccines.gov website](#). The map is searchable by vaccine brand and zip code, up to a 50-mile radius. Jackson CVS, Safeway, Walgreens, and Walmart pharmacies are all offering COVID-19 vaccine by appointment. Vaccine appointments are scheduled via their respective websites. Residents may also reach out to their health care provider to inquire if vaccine is available within their health care system.

All Amador County residents and visitors are encouraged to do their part in order to stay safe and stay open.
