2. No Place Like Home (NPLH) Presentation

A presentation by Danco Communities on what Danco Communities is, what they do and their experience in affordable housing development as well as experience with NPLH was given to the Task Force. Present from Danco Communities was Chris Dart (President), McKenzie Dibble (Project Manager), and McKenzie (Project Manager). Also present at the presentation was Sherry Morgado (Housing Tools).

- Danco currently has ~20 housing project underway
- Many examples of the projects being built were given
- The Inn at Temescal project in Oakland was described that used project Homekey funds to rehabilitate an old hotel
- Danco is tentatively planning on building 40 units here in Amador (20 studio, 6 1bedroom, 10 2-bedroom, and 3 3-bedroom units)
- 20 of those units are reserved to house anyone suffering from severe mental health issues.

4. Mobile Showers Project

Continued discussion of the Mobile Showers idea occurred. Ron Monk originally provided a proposal for acquiring a mobile shower unit and how it could be operated. The cost of a dual shower unit is \$32,228. It would be made available at least once a week. It would require two teams of 3-4 volunteers. The trailer could be stored at the Church of the Nazerene. In addition it would have to be registered and insured. May need a generator for running lights and heaters. Waste water would have to be eliminated at a sanitary site like Sweet Pea Septic.
