AMADOR COUNTY EMERGENCY MEDICAL CARE COMMITTEE MINUTES, JULY 28, 2021

CALL TO ORDER/INTRODUCTIONS: Jeff Brown called the meeting to order at 10:04 a.m.

SIGN IN, QUORUM: A quorum was present.

MINUTES: Jeff Brown asked for approval of the January 27, 2021 minutes.

MOTION: Lindsey Clark made a motion to accept the April 28, 2021 minutes as presented. Ryan Hamre seconded and the motion passed.

CORRESPONDENCE/PUBLIC FORUM: None.

AGENDA: Jeff Brown asked for approval of the agenda.

MOTION: Ryan Hamre made a motion to approve the agenda, Lindsey Clark seconded and the motion passed.

FINANCIAL REPORT: Lindsey Clark informed the Committee that the current balance in the EMS account is \$31,894.81 and it is likely we will have to return \$8,660.65 to the State, which would leave our balance at \$23,234.16. We are receiving an average of \$6,000.00, annually. We have annual commitments for the radio vault at Mt. Zion and EMSystem that average about \$2,650.00.

LOCAL CQI COMMITTEE REPORT: Michelle Tyer- CQI meeting was held last week. They meet every other month. There is an uptick in call volume for fire, ambulance and hospital patients. The committee is completing audits on stroke victims for timing from call coming in all the way to hospital admittance. They are trying to shorten times from arrival at hospital to definitive treatment plan. Justin Murdock - Amador County is doing a trial study with the Zoll auto pulse device. Lead by Buena Vista Fire with assistance from ALA.

LOCAL CQI COMMITTEE REPORT: Lucas device trial study in Amador has been paused by Dr. Sloan, Medical Director. Ryan Hamre, stated that the devices have been pulled off engines and crews are doing daily training to become more comfortable with the devices. Devices are housed at Stations 111 and 122.

MOUNTAIN VALLEY EMS AGENCY: MVEMSA is moving to a two tier (BLS/ALS) response system. They are currently working on policy updates. Stanislaus County is removing themselves from the JPA. Board meetings are now monthly.

AMBULANCE: Two new ambulances are now in service. All first out ambulances are using new power gurneys, which dramatically helps with the prevention of staff injuries. ALA has been given approval to give the booster for COVID-19 for first responders and health care workers. Clinic is on November 3^{rd} from 9:30 - 2:30.

Zion – oral repeater and radio system was down – which delayed all the responses. We reported the issue and it seemed like nothing got taken care of so ALA stepped up and contacted the radio tech and had it fixed. When the bill is received, I will submit to the EMCC for reimbursement. It's the County's responsibility for the infrastructure of the. Jessica said that was her understanding also (when they had internal problems

with their radios) she was told ACSO had responsibility over it. Mr. McNany said this needs to be researched and figure out who is responsible for the infrastructure. Supervisor Crew said he'd look into it and find out.

Re: Financial Report for EMCC Meeting on 4/27/22

The current EMS fund sits at \$23,882.67.

The current agenda does not have any pending requests for funds.

Currently the reoccurring annual invoices for EMCC are as follows:

- EMS Systems \$1,545.04
- CalFire (lease of radio vault storage at Mt. Zion) \$1,014.00with an annual increase of 5% per year

The annual income to the EMS fund averages around \$5,500.00 per year.
