Amador Air District (AAD) Directors were not in favor of having additional burn permits and fees imposed to our residents. Our Board suggested to Mr. Chew that if his agency wanted to continue to pursue this topic, it should be brought to AFPD Board of Directors and not AAD.

Draft Budget for FY 2022 - 2023: Discussion and Possible Action

APCO Perry explained her approach to the budget is to achieve a balance between our projected revenues and projected expenditures. We have been developing and implementing new programs/projects to gradually reduce the carry-over forward that adds to the reserve funds.

Line item 54712 is budgeted at \$125,000. This includes \$80,000 for CCAD, \$40,000 to start a new program for small off-road engines (SORE) replacement program, and \$5,000 for special projects.

Line item 54120 is budgeted at \$234,813. This includes \$99,000 rolled over from previous budget for the Green Vehicle Police Incentive program, \$50,000 for our Electric Vehicle Charging Station program, and \$75,813 for our Smoke Reduction Bin Program.

Line item 54715 was budgeted at \$50,000. This money will help account for any unforeseeable future projects from the Carl Moyer Program.

WHEREAS, the District Board of Directors took all statements, arguments or other written or oral evidence concerning said budget into account before adopting the final budget.

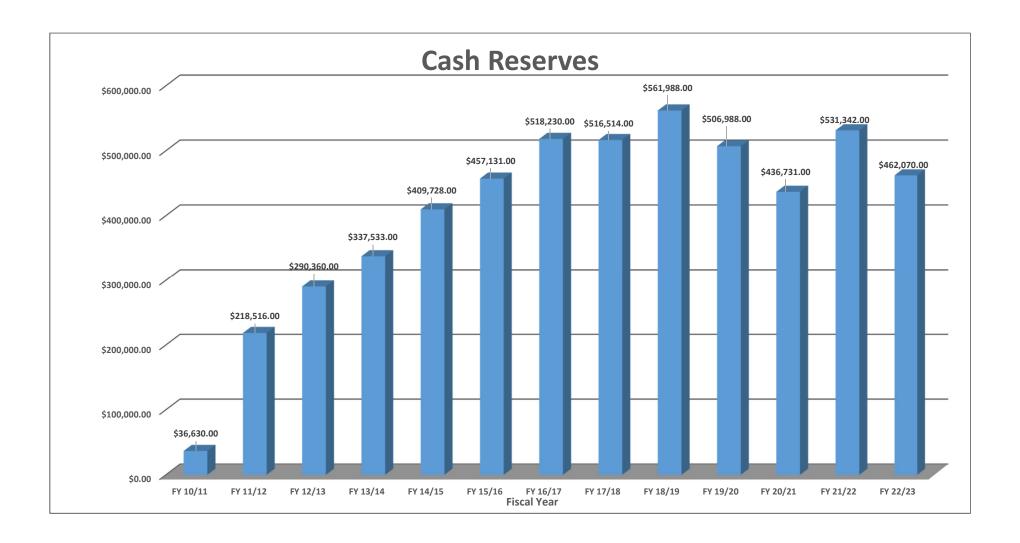

Subject: Small Off-Road Engine (SORE) Residential Rebate Program - DRAFT

Assembly Bill 2086 requires the State Air Resources Board to adopt cost-effective and technologically feasible regulations to prohibit engine exhaust and evaporative emissions from new small off-road engines produces on or after January 1, 2024.

With AB 2086 in mind, the Amador Air District (AAD) would like to start a small off-road engine residential rebate program. The purpose of our program is to help homeowners replace old gas or diesel powered lawn and yard equipment with new electric equipment. We would also offer incentives for those residents that currently do not own any electric powered equipment but would like to.

At this time, I have attached a draft layout of the guidelines we would like to offer as part of our program. This is still a work in progress but wanted to give you a glimpse of it and accept any suggestions for improvement.

Recommendation:

Provide staff suggestions for program improvements and/or allow staff to continue to fine tune the program and bring back to next Board meeting for final approval.

Residential Rebate Program Guidelines

The small off-road engine (SORE) rebate programs provides options for Amador County residents. Option 1 is for replacement of old gas or diesel powered lawn and yard equipment with new electric equipment. Option 2 is for the purchase of new electric powered lawn and yard equipment with no old equipment being turned in. Applications are processed on a first-come, first-serve basis while funds are available.

Eligible Rebate Amount - The rebate is based on the purchase price of the electric equipment and does not include additional costs such as taxes, fees, accessories and delivery charges.

Equipment Types: Lawn mower, edger, string and hedge trimmers, chainsaws, blowers, and pole saw

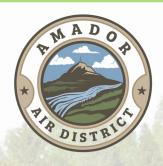
