ACTION REQUIRED

EMERGENCY EVACUATION: You **MUST EVACUATE IMMEDIATELY. A THREAT TO YOUR LIFE EXISTS.** An EMERGENCY EVACUATION notice is issued when a hazard is moving towards an area and there is an immediate threat to life and property.

VOLUNTARY EVACUATION: You are NOT REQUIRED to EVACUATE at this time, however, persons issued this warning are ENCOURAGED TO EVACUATE and relocate the MEDICALLY FRAGILE, LIVESTOCK and PETS. If you choose not to evacuate at this time it is strongly recommended that you PREPARE TO EVACUATE. Conditions can change rapidly creating a threatening situation to occur and this may be your only notice.

SHELTER IN PLACE: It is SAFE TO REMAIN INDOORS, SEE REVERSE SIDE for additional instructions.

If you NEED TRANSPORTATION to EVACUATE THE AREA, notify officials evacuating your neighborhood or call 223-6500.

EVACUATION INSTRUCTIONS:

When an emergency has the potential of becoming life threatening, you may be asked to evacuate. When directed to evacuate, take the following steps:

- Listen to your car radio for information. **KFBK 1530 AM or local Hometown Radio station.**
- Stay calm – gather your family. Evacuate immediately if ordered.
- If time permits, gather only those essential items that you need.
- Your children in school will be taken to the evacuation center/shelter for their school area if it is necessary to move them from school.
- Lock your house, turn off lights and household appliances. Turn off gas at the source if possible. Your neighborhood will be patrolled while you are gone.
- Do not use more than one car for your family. Take neighbors who need a ride. Keep windows and vents closed.
- Police or other officials will direct you to a Public Shelter if needed.
- Register your presence at the Public Shelter so you can be found if necessary.

Items you may need to take with you including this leaflet are:

- Checkbook, credit cards, cash, home insurance policy.
- Driver's license, other identification.
- Important papers.
- Extra clothing, blankets.
- Eyeglasses, dentures, prescriptions, other medicines, and first aid kit.
- Baby supplies such as diapers and formula.
- Portable radio, flashlight, fresh batteries.
- Pets, pet food, leashes, cages. Note that pets are not allowed in Public Shelters.

SHELTERING IN PLACE:

Sheltering in Place is a method to help keep contaminated air out of your home. When advised, immediately follow these steps:

- Go inside your home or workplace. Bring in your pets if possible. Grab your disaster supply kit and choose a room upstairs with few or no windows.
- Close all doors and windows. Use duct tape, wet rags or similar materials to seal air leaks around doors and windows if necessary.
- School children will be safe with school officials who are prepared to take special care of them. **DO NOT** go to the school to pick up your children.
- Do not use telephone lines. They will be needed for emergency personnel.
- Stay inside until your TV, radio, or an official announces that you may safely leave. If the emergency involved hazardous materials, authorities will notify you when to open windows and doors to ventilate the building.
