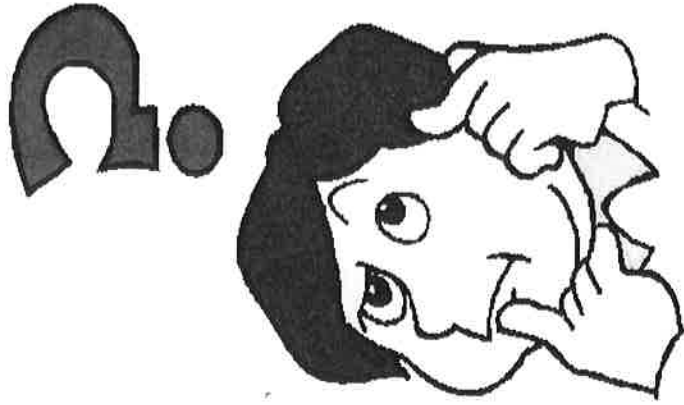


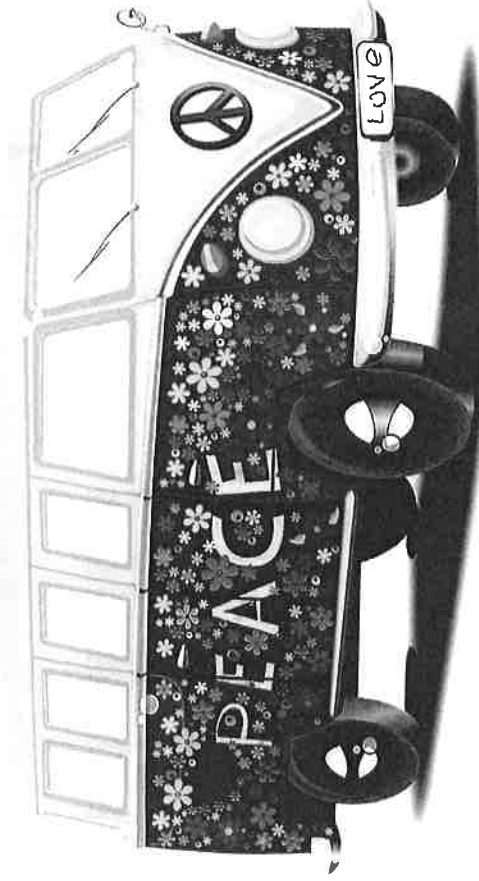
What are the Overtime Limits and overtime pay?



- ✓ Maximum weekly hours a Provider can work is 66 hours. The 16 hours over the normal 40 hour work week in this situation is okay. This usually occurs with providers that work for more than 1 recipient. Again **do not** go over a recipient's weekly authorized hours
- ✓ Each IHSS consumer's monthly authorized hours will be divided by 4.33 to determine their maximum weekly hours

- ✓ Overtime pay is time-and-a-half (1.5 times the hour rate)
- ✓ In Amador County the current pay rate is \$15.00 per hour, so the overtime rate is \$22.50 per hour

What is Travel Time?



- ✓ If an IHSS provider cared for more than one consumer and the IHSS consumers live in different locations, IHSS providers may be paid for the time it takes them to travel directly from consumer 1 to consumer 2, up to 7 hours per week
- ✓ The 7 hours are not included in the weekly authorized hours that the recipient has. These are additional hours only to be claimed with the above scenario
- ✓ Travel time is to be recorded on a travel claim form and in order for a claim form to be sent, a provider must complete the SCO 2255 and return it to Amador County IHSS Payroll

What is Wait Time?

- ✓ If an IHSS provider accompanies the IHSS recipient to a doctor's appointment and if **REQUIRED** to wait for them, the IHSS provider may now be paid for that time
- ✓ You will not be paid for time sitting in the waiting area while your recipient is being seen by the doctor. This is a good time to do other chores
- ✓ If there are any questions about wait time have your recipient contact their IHSS Social Worker
- ✓ You are not paid fuel money by IHSS. This is between you and your recipient. If you do drive your recipient around, you need to have insurance. Contact your car insurance carrier
- ✓ There are free transportation services for people on IHSS Services
