Re: Recommendation to Terminate Local Emergency Declarations Related to COVID-19

A novel coronavirus SARS CoV-2 that causes the disease named "COVID-19" was first detected in Wuhan City, Hubei Province, China, in December 2019. The number of reported cases of COVID-19 escalated dramatically over a short period of time in the first months of 2020. On March 4, 2020, the Governor of California issued a Proclamation of a State of Emergency as a result of the outbreak of COVID-19 and on March 11, 2020, the World Health Organization declared the outbreak to be a pandemic.

On March 11, 2020, the California Department of Public Health issued guidance to limit the spread of COVID-19 as community transmission of the virus was occurring in California. Health and Safety Code section 101080 authorizes a local health officer to declare a local health emergency in the health officer's jurisdiction, or any part thereof, whenever the health officer reasonably determines that there is an imminent and proximate threat of the introduction of any contagious, infectious, or communicable disease, chemical agent, non-communicable biologic agent, toxin, or radioactive agent. Therefore, on March 12, 2020, Amador County Health Officer Rita H. Kerr, M.D. declared a local health emergency in the County of Amador due to the imminent and proximate threat of the spread of COVID-19 in the County. On March 17, 2020 Sheriff Martin Ryan issued a Proclamation of a Local Emergency as the Director of Emergency Services for Amador County. The local emergency proclamations were ratified by the Board of Supervisors on March 19, 2020.

Over the past three years, much has been learned about the novel coronavirus SARS CoV-2. Preventive strategies including vaccination, ventilation, and use of personal preventive measures mitigate spread of the virus. Testing (including at-home tests) and antiviral treatments that are effective in preventing severe illness are now available. Supply chain scarcity and impact to hospitals have become manageable. California will terminate the statewide COVID-19 State of Emergency at the end of February 2023, continuing the principles of the state's SMARTER Plan to keep COVID-19 in check.

Concurrently, Amador County Public Health and Health Officer Rita H. Kerr, M.D., in consultation with the Amador County Sheriff's Office of Emergency Services (OES), deem the local response to COVID-19 no longer necessitates local emergency status. We recommend that the Board of Supervisors terminate the local health emergency and Amador County OES emergency proclamation for COVID-19 as of February 28, 2023.

WHEREAS, Concurrently, Amador County Public Health and Health Officer Rita H. Kerr, M.D., in consultation with the Amador County Sheriff's Office of Emergency Services (OES), deem the local response to COVID-19 no longer necessitates local emergency status.

THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED that the Board of Supervisors of the County of Amador, State of California, does hereby terminate Local Emergency Declarations related to COVID-19.
