

ORDINANCE NO. 1713

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING BOUNDARIES OF SUPERVISORIAL DISTRICTS

The Board of Supervisors of the County of Amador ordains as follows:

SECTION I. This ordinance establishes the decennial supervisorial redistricting plan for Amador County as required by Elections Code sections 21500 – 21506, by adjusting the boundaries of the Amador County supervisorial districts.

SECTION II. This ordinance repeals Section 2.04.130 of Chapter 2.04 of the Amador County Code is hereby repealed, and the following Section 2.04.130 is substituted in its place:

“2.04.130 Supervisorial Districts. The boundaries of the supervisorial districts of the county are hereby amended to correspond to those shown on the official map on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors entitled Official Map, Supervisorial District Boundaries, adopted October, 2011. The official Supervisorial District Map shall be available to the public at the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors and the Election Department.”

SECTION III. This ordinance shall be published in a newspaper of general circulation printed in the County of Amador, State of California, and shall become effective thirty (30) days after the date of adoption.

The foregoing ordinance was duly passed and adopted by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Amador at a regular meeting thereof, held on the 25th day of October, 2011, by the following vote:


