WHEREAS, through the Order's individual parlors throughout the state, in their individual communities, and through the offices of the Grand Parlor statewide, Ursula Parlor No. 1 has pursued benevolent and humanitarian causes beyond number; and

WHEREAS, Native Daughters support the non-profit program known as the Children's Foundation by donating monies for medical expenses for children from birth through the age of 18 whose parents/guardians cannot afford these expenses; and

WHEREAS, Native Daughters participate in various projects throughout the State such as their Childrens Foundation helping children whose families could not otherwise afford medical assistance, Veterans assistance, helping to restore Missions and Lighthouses, assisting in other civic activities, and much more; and

THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED that the Board of Supervisors of the County of Amador, State of California, does hereby recognize the Native Daughters of the Golden West and Ursula Parlor No. 1, upon the occasion of their 137th Grand Parlor Annual Meeting.
