WHEREAS, California Welfare and Institutions Code section 6600, *et seq.* relates to certain evaluations and hearings involving state prison inmates that may fall within the definition of a sexually violent predator (“SVP”); and

WHEREAS, Welfare and Institutions Code section 6601, subsection (i), specifically requires, in part, that each county’s board of supervisors must “designate either the district attorney or the county counsel to assume responsibility for proceedings” involving SVPs; and

WHEREAS, the Amador County District Attorney has always handled these matters and is best suited to do so, and is willing to continue handling them.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Amador that:


1. That the Amador County District Attorney is designated with responsibility for proceeding under California Welfare and Institutions Code section 6600, *et seq.*
