WHEREAS, The Amador County Water Agency was founded as a special district in July 1959; and

WHEREAS, The Amador County Water Agency provided treated water to hundreds of Upcountry customers when wells stopped producing during a drought in the 1970's; and

WHEREAS, the agency has replaced hundreds of deteriorating service lines, wells, and tanks and improved facilities throughout Amador County; and

WHEREAS, the agency ended a 20 year moratorium on new hook-ups in Plymouth when they completed the Plymouth Pipeline, which also improved service in Amador City and Drytown; and

WHEREAS, the Amador water Agency has made great strides in water conservation by their construction of the Amador Transmission Pipeline and three Recycling Plants; and

WHEREAS, the agency constantly collaborates with Amador County Fire Protection Agencies to improve reliability and fire flows in order to protect communities throughout our county; and

WHEREAS, the Amador Water Agency has cut carbon emissions and reduced energy costs by completing the Gravity Supply Line and generating hydroelectric power; and

WHEREAS, the Amador Water Agency has successfully secured millions of dollars of state and federal grant funds allowing the Agency to make major infrastructure improvements and replacements at little or no cost to Amador County ratepayers;

THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED that the Board of Supervisors of the County of Amador, State of California, does hereby recognize and join with the Amador Water Agency in celebration of the Agency's 60th anniversary and in commending the Agency's contribution to quality of life in Amador County.
