WHEREAS, since 2000, Lynda has been the Executive Director of Kene Me-Wu Family Healing Center, a Native American domestic violence/sexual assault program, where she utilizes her substance abuse counseling and domestic violence/sexual assault counseling skills to help Native women better their lives; and

WHEREAS, Lynda currently sits on the California Domestic Violence Advisory Council, appointed by Governor Schwarzenegger in 2010 and reappointed by Governor Brown in 2015. She created a Tribal Advocate Training Curriculum and has taught the classes. Her work has led her to believe that working together we can find solutions to end violence for all future generations.
