WHEREAS, Robert Harmon was born on August 20, 1985 and raised in Amador County; and

WHEREAS, Robert left Amador High School in 2002 to go on home study to pursue his dreams of bowling on the Professional Bowlers Tour then graduated from Independence High School in 2003; and

WHEREAS, Robert was hired by the Amador County Sheriff's Office as a correctional officer in 2005 and while working full time, put himself through the police academy graduating in November of 2009; and

WHEREAS, Robert was hired by the Sutter Creek Police Department as a Reserve Police Officer in September 2012, and in March 2013 was hired full time. He was voted Sutter Creek Police Officer of the Year in 2014 then earned the MADD (Mothers Against Drunk Driving) award for DUI related arrests in 2015, 2016, and 2017; and

WHEREAS, Robert's love of bowling has not faded so he competed in the 2016 Police and Fire Games in San Diego winning 2 gold medals and 2 silver medals in bowling and in 2017 he went on to compete in the World Police and Fire Games winning 3 gold medals and 1 silver medal in bowling.


THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Amador, State of California, that said Board does hereby honor and commend Robert Harmon upon being selected as the Amador County Peace Officers' Association 2018 Peace Officer of the Year.
