WHEREAS, existing codes and policies lack sufficient guidance regarding grazing, maintaining, breeding, training, and raising of poultry and livestock in a manner consistent with proper and accepted customs and standards.

THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED that the Board of Supervisors of the County of Amador, State of California, intends to develop an ordinance establishing criteria for livestock operations.
