A RESOLUTION APPOINTING AN INDEPENDENT HEARING PANEL FOR THE LOCAL ENFORCEMENT AGENCY PURSUANT TO THE CALIFORNIA INTEGRATED WASTE MANAGEMENT ACT

**RESOLUTION NO. 17-026** 

WHEREAS, the County of Amador has designated the Environmental Health Department as the Local Enforcement Agency to carry out provisions of the California Integrated Waste Management Act; and

WHEREAS, California Public Resources Code (PRC) Section 44300 provides that all hearings required to be conducted under PRC Section 44310 and the California Code of Regulations (CCR), Title 14, Division 7, relating to permit, enforcement, and appeal issues, shall be heard by an independent hearing panel. The independent hearing panel is appointed pursuant to PRC Section 44308 (a) (2) and CCR, Title 14, Section 18060 and 18081(e) (2) by the local governing body of the designated Local Enforcement Agency (LEA); and

WHEREAS, said hearing panel is also a required component of the LEA certification package to the Department of Resources, Recycling and Recovery (CalRecycle); and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors does not appoint itself as the hearing panel; and

WHEREAS, the hearing panel must have three persons with not more than one member of the local governing body. At least one member must be a representative of the public at large and one must be a technical expert with knowledge of solid waste management methods and technology; and

WHEREAS, the term of service for members of the hearing panel is four years. Panel members may serve more than one, four year term, but not more than two consecutive terms; and

WHEREAS, vacancies exist in panel membership.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Supervisors of the County of Amador, State of California, being the local governing body, appoints an Independent Hearing Panel. The following members of the Independent Hearing Panel are appointed pursuant to Public Resources Code Section 44308 (b) (1), (3), and (4):
