RESOLUTION NO. 17-090

WHEREAS, the County of Amador, State of California (hereinafter referred to as "Agency"), is a contracting agency of the Public Employees' Retirement System; and

WHEREAS, the Public Employee's Retirement Law requires that a contracting agency determine whether an employee of such agency in employment in which she is classified as a local safety member is disabled for purposes of the Public Employees' Retirement Law and whether such disability is "industrial" within the meaning of such law; and

WHEREAS, an application for the Industrial Disability Retirement of right shoulder injury from Lisa Schnepple employed by the Agency in the position of Deputy Probation Officer has been filed with the Public Employees' Retirement System; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors has reviewed the medical and other evidence relevant to such alleged disability.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Supervisors hereby find and determine that Lisa Schnepple is incapacitated within the meaning of the Public Employees' Retirement Law for performance of her duties in the position of Deputy Probation Officer and does hereby certify under penalty of perjury that this determination was made on the basis of competent medical opinion and was not used as a substitute for the disciplinary process in accordance with Government Code section 211569a)(2).

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Lisa Schnepple had filed a Workers' Compensation claim for her disabling condition. The Workers' Compensation claim was accepted.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board of Supervisors find and determine and it does find and determine that such disability is arising out of and in the course of employment.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that neither said Lisa Schnepple nor the Agency has applied to the Workers' Compensation Appeals Board for a determination pursuant to Government Code section 21166 whether such disability is industrial.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that no issue of third party liability is present in the disability

of said Lisa Schnepple.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that there will be no advanced disability pension payments paid to the member.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the primary disabling condition is categorized as Orthopedic (right shoulder); and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Lisa Schnepple has been accommodated with modified duty or receiving TTD since September 17, 2015.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED the duration of the disabling condition has permanently incapacitated her from performing the substantial duties of her occupation.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that her last day on pay status is October 31, 2017.
