Health and Safety Code Section 25503(c) requires an Administering Agency to establish an area plan for emergency response to a release or threatened release of a hazardous material within its jurisdiction; and

WHEREAS, The Hazardous Materials Emergency Response Area Plan is incorporated as Annex B of the County's Emergency Operations Plan and provides a framework for area responders in responding to a hazardous materials release. The draft plan was circulated to involved agencies for comment on September 25, 2013 and a Final Draft submitted to the Board on February 3, 2014; and

WHEREAS, The CUPA shall certify that it has conducted a complete review of its area plan. A Final Area Plan dated January, 2014 was submitted to the Board of Supervisors on February 3, 2014.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT, the Amador County Board of Supervisors has accepted the January, 2014 Hazardous Materials Emergency Response Area Plan and authorized the implementation of the Plan.
