WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors for the County of Amador has the authority to implement Government Code Section 20691; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors for the County of Amador had a written labor policy or agreement which specifically provided for the normal member contributions to be paid by the employer; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors for the County of Amador has renegotiated said policy or agreement and now has a written agreement that provides for a reduction in the amount of the normal member contributions to be paid by the employer; and

WHEREAS, one of the steps in the procedures to implement Section 20691 is the adoption by the governing body of the County of Amador of a Resolution relative to said Employer Paid Member Contributions (EPMC); and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors for the County of Amador has identified the following conditions for the purpose of revising its election to pay EPMC:

- This revised benefit shall apply to all Mid-Management Employees.
- This revised benefit shall consist of a reduction in the current EPMC as follows: the EPMC shall be reduced from seven percent (7%) to (i) four percent (4%) on April 1, 2011, and (ii) one percent (1%) on October 1, 2011.
- The effective date of this Resolution shall be April 1, 2011.


BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Amador, State of California that the County of Amador elects to pay EPMC as set forth in the last recital above.
