WHEREAS, Article XIII, Section 16 of the California Constitution empowers the Board of Supervisors in each county to adopt rules of notice and procedures for Board of Equalization as may be required to facilitate their work and to insure uniformity in the processing and decision of equalization; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Equalization presently does not charge applicants a fee for processing assessment appeal applications; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Equalization currently charges \$10.00 for Findings of Facts, which is inadequate as compared to the County Counsel staff time consumed to prepare findings; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors wishes to establish a processing fee and amend the Findings of Fact Fee in connection with the processing of assessment appeal applications; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Equalization has proposed the following fee schedule, which appears consistent with applicable legal mandates.


Assessment Appeals Processing Fee: \$30.00 to be paid at the time of filing (which fee may be waived where the applicant would qualify for a waiver of court fees and costs pursuant to California Government Code Section 68632).

Findings of Fact Fee: \$65.00 for owner occupied single family residential applications, \$100.00 per hour for non-owner occupied residential applications and commercial applications.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Supervisors of the County of Amador, State of California, does hereby adopt the aforementioned fees relating to assessment appeals.

The foregoing resolution was duly passed and adopted by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Amador at a regular meeting thereof, held on the 24th day of May, 2011 by the following vote:


