WHEREAS, the Prevention and Early Intervention component of the Mental Health Services Act (MHSA) funds preventative programs. The community of Amador County proposes to identify and treat mental health issues as early as possible, to prevent an individual's need for intensive services, and to transition individuals needing further treatment into the mental health system; and

WHEREAS, the proposed plan is a result of a year of community education and five months of intensive planning in compliance with state guidelines for process and content that involved more than 260 dedicated community members who chose to share their experience and expertise;

BE IT RESOLVED that the Amador County Board of Supervisors does hereby approve the Mental Health Services Act Prevention and Early Intervention 3-Year Program and Expenditure Plan for Amador County.
