RESOLUTION NO. 10-124

WHEREAS, Jackie Long was a Student Patrol Officer at Reedley College from 1979 to 1980; a Reserve Police Officer at Reedley Police Department from 1980 to 1981; and a Police Officer for the Hanford Police Department from 1981 to 1988; and

WHEREAS, Jackie started working for the Department of Justice, Bureau of Narcotic Enforcement in 1988, working at the Fresno Office specializing in clandestine laboratory investigations; transferring to the Advanced Training Center in 1992; transferring to the San Diego Office in 2000 to work border operations; transferring again in 2001 to the Sacramento Office working clandestine laboratory investigation and Campaign Against Marijuana Planting (CAMP) before transferring in 2002 to Bureau of Narcotic Enforcement Head Quarters in Sacramento as the Clandestine Laboratory Coordinator for State Wide Operations until 2007; and

WHEREAS, Jackie was selected to the position of Commander of the Amador County Combined Narcotics Enforcement Team (ACCNET) in November 2007 and led the team until his promotion back to Bureau of Narcotic Enforcement Head Quarters in Sacramento in August 2010; and

WHEREAS, during his tenure as task force commander, Jackie successfully presented county wide law enforcement training for drug influence recognition, multiple community presentations relative to controlled substances, and drug awareness training to Amador County High Schools and Amador County Social Services; and

WHEREAS, Jackie revised the county-wide Drug Endangered Children’s protocol, he established a county wide drug precursor program that resulted in numerous investigations; and his efforts led to the dismantling of four Mexican National Drug Organizations; and

WHEREAS, under Jackie’s supervision ACCNET has conducted 345 investigations, executed 53 Search Warrants, 164 Consent Searches and 122 Probation/Parole Searches resulting in 386 arrests and the seizure of the following:

Bulk Marijuana:	126 pounds
Marijuana Plants:	92,719 plants
Hashish:	535 grams
Methamphetamine:	524 grams
Heroin:	139 grams
Cocaine:	104 grams
Pseudo Ephedrine:	1,373 pills
Pharmaceuticals:	10,059 pills
MDMA:	187 pills
Firearms:	36 handguns, 37 rifles, 15 shotguns
