WHEREAS, the Mental Health Services Act Workforce, Education and Training Plan (WET) is required by the California Department of Mental Health to go through an extensive planning process and was prepared for formal committee members and open for public comment over a period of five months. It was also posted at the County's website for the required 30 days and was approved by the Amador County Mental Health Advisory Board on June 16, 2010 to be presented to the Amador County Board of Supervisors for approval and implementation; and

WHEREAS, the Workforce, Education and Training component of the Mental Health Services Act (MHSA) funds the development of a coordinated and competency based workforce. The community of Amador County proposes to identify and provide comprehensive training and supervision of the Behavioral Health Workforce in developing evidenced based practices, to enhance the identification and treatment of mental health problems.

WHEREAS, the proposed plan is a result of a year of community education and five months of intensive planning in compliance with state guidelines for process and content that involved more than 260 dedicated community members who chose to share their experience and expertise;

BE IT RESOLVED that the Amador County Board of Supervisors does hereby approve the Mental Health Services Act Workforce, Education and Training Plan (WET) 3-Year Program and Expenditure Plan for Amador County.
