WHEREAS, May 24, 2024, would be an appropriate date to designate as National Poppy Day.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Amador, State of California, that said Board does hereby proclaim the month of May 2024, as POPPY MONTH and Friday May 24th as National POPPY DAY, and ask that all citizens pay tribute to those who have made the ultimate sacrifice in the name of freedom by wearing the Memorial Poppy during this month.
