The Amador Area of the California Highway Patrol received the "Notice of Completion and Environmental Document Transmittal" for the proposed Wicklow Way Specific Plan, State Clearinghouse (SCH) #2023010563. After review, we have concerns with the potential impact this project could have on traffic congestion.

Our concern relates to the development of 201 acres at the end of Wicklow Way, with the proposed construction of 700 residences, 24.4 acres of commercial properties, and 10 acres of recreational area. Wicklow Way currently terminates at State Route 88 (SR-88), which is the major arterial route from the City of Jackson and surrounding areas to the Stockton Area. Wicklow Way is controlled at the intersection of SR-88 by a stop sign. There are currently no traffic controls at this intersection for traffic on SR-88. This project could have a negative impact on our operations due to the increased traffic congestion at this intersection, which could necessitate the need for additional traffic control measures to mitigate the potential increase in traffic collisions within our jurisdiction.

The secondary exit of this plan is onto Stoney Creek Road. To reach the main arterial route of State Route 49 (SR-49) and travel north or south from this location, you must travel through the intersections of Hoffman Street and SR-49 or Argonaut Lane and SR-49. Both intersections are uncontrolled for traffic on SR-49 and controlled by stop signs on Hoffman Street and Argonaut Lane. Due to the increased traffic congestion at these intersections, they would also potentially need additional traffic control measures to mitigate the increased traffic.
