PRESS RELEASE

The Amador County Board of Supervisors today announced that the Buena Vista Rancheria of Me-Wuk Indians of California (Tribe) and the County have agreed to an extension of time for negotiations. The negotiation period will be extended until such time as either the Tribe or the County delivers to the other a 7-day written notice to terminate negotiations. Either side may demand arbitration after that point. In any event, no termination of negotiations shall occur prior to August 10, 2007.

Under a Compact between the Tribe and the State of California, the Tribe proposes a gaming and entertainment facility to be located on the east side of Coal Mine Road, in the unincorporated area of Amador County, near what is commonly known as Buena Vista in the Jackson Valley. The initial deadline for negotiations was July 11, 2007.
